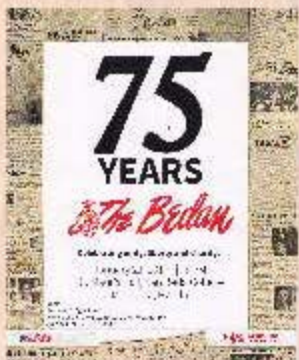

RELIVING THE PAST, THANKFUL FOR THE PRESENT AND HOPEFUL FOR THE FUTURE

The Bedan marked its 75th anniversary last January 20 (Saturday), in St. Maur's Hall. I was under the weather but attended anyway and saw a number of long-time and valued friends, teachers, contemporaries and successors, such as Sonny Belmonte, Spanky Perez, Buddy Gomez, Oscar Contreras, et al.. Uplifting and energizing.

We relived a part of our school's past, such as when Ninoy Aquino breezed through high school in three years, and became the Manila Times' teenaged correspondent during the Korean War, which started in 1950. I was a promid in Pasig, where I started campus journalism as a sports columnist in the Rizalian of Rizal Hi. In Makati Elem, I read in the Manila Times sports columnist Red Smith's quote from Thomas Gray's Elegy Written in a Country Churchyard.

I came here in 1955, a hick or country bumpkin, in a world of "San Beda Boys Low-Waist". It was qua sports columnist that I started in the Bedan (recruited by AB classmate Jay Sapala, quoted by the New York Times last May, on a story on then Davao City Mayor Digong Duterte singing a Sinatra song as part of the night life in that City).

I became Bedan ed-on-chief in 1962-63, when I also became college chess champion and finished law cum laude.

My Bedan experience as a stude was fun-filled and fulfilling. In 1967, as first awardee of a new Faculty Development Program of Fr. Alex Garuza (properly laicized), I rushed an application to Harvard Law in a rinky-dink typewriter, beyond the deadline. I sort of "warned" that it might be sorry someday were I not accepted and allowed to roam in the "sacred precincts of Harvard Yard." It worked, ha, ha; it quickly responded with a generous scholarship offer.

San Beda had refined my ability to make words speak. And charm.

I am thankful, with certain reservations, for what goes on now and look at the present and future with rose-colored glasses.

We have a Prez and Veep who both attended San Beda, along with a number of Cabinet members. I was Prefect or Vice Dean when Digong was a remarkable law senior in 1972 and Leni was my unassuming stude in grad law school in 2013 (she understandably quit on getting elected as Cong that year).

I do have problems with EJKs, traffic, Kanto Boy language (promids I associate with kinder, gentler language), death penalty restoration, etc.. Overall however, I remain hopeful there will be course corrections, to show respect for human life and dignity and long-time friends and/or devils we know, or even devils we don't.

Friends pa more.

I saw Mr. and Mrs. Donald Trump last January 19, together, on stage, in his Inaugural as next U.S. Prez. And how he danced with the wifey, not any kulaksl.

Would that Digong marry Honeylet, to avoid awkwardness, make the couple an honest one, and good role models following the laws of God and man, and not confuse the young on the value of sacred holy matrimony, which so mattered in our earlier Jurassic generation. And enjoy pa more blessings from Heaven.

Digong need not worry about a coup. Our people may be too busy partying or taking selfies, not worrying nor hurrying but stopping to smell the flowers.

To paraphrase Ted Kennedy, in seeing hope in the young, which I note in my human rights studes - for those whose cares have been our concern, the work goes on, the cause endures, the hope still lives, and the dream - for a better life for everyone - shall never die.

I see Prez Digong meeting with Marcos human rights victims. Good. I was in the Cathedral for Cardinal Tagle's well-attended Mass for druggies organized by the Fazenda de Esperanza. We have just had here the World Apostolic Congress on Divine Mercy. Very good. Hope, healing and forgiving spring eternal.

Kudos to the deserving 2017 homecoming awardees, who will help in the process. I laud and note in particular Cong. Rey Umali and his stance on the eye-for-eye-tooth-for-a-tooth-rape-the-rapist death penalty by public hanging. Every life matters, Rey, and we don't ever give up on anyone.

Counting from Prep class, 37 years has elapsed since I sojourned the hallowed halls and grand archways of San Beda. My daughter's question brought back multitudinous memories, from the precocious and insouciant playing under to sun, towards the nascent of erudite academic studies and the pursuit of achieving goals, aspirations and dreams. Because of the benevolence of friends and faculty of San Beda, I recognize them as my family. I am grateful to San Beda for my education, my acquired knowledge, life-lessons and values. Enriched and nurtured by the seminal influence of St. Benedict, I owe my stronger Catholic upbringing, my development, and my identity as a Bedan to San Beda



College.

The Batch of GS-88, HS-92 will be hosting the Alumni Homecoming and Reunion this coming February 4, 2017. I can only imagine seeing all my former classmates and friends gathering once again for a grand and happy get-together. Seeing each other would instantly induce reminiscence of past experiences, recalling favorite moments at school and forging bonds with long lost friends. Some would likely discuss about their first day of school when they were in Prep Class and how they met their best friends, who later on became their Bedan brothers as time progressed. Seeing the campus again, we appreciate the beautiful and serene courtyards, the Roman Garden, the Fountain and the overall Neo-Gothic architecture of the main building. As alumni gather for the Mass at the Our Lady of Montserrat Abbey Church, we recall our reception of the Sacrament of Reconciliation,



First Communion and the celebration of First Friday and Graduation Masses. In my honest opinion, the sacrosanct Abbey church is the precious jewel of our school, with its ornate frescoes that rival the intricate design of the Sistine Chapel in Rome. Illuminated by the numerous Angel candelabras, the grandeur of the church is witnessed during the celebration of the Eucharist.

As a student, everyone knew how to borrow books especially *The Adventures of Tintin*, *Asterix* and *Obelix* at the school library. Everyone remembers playing trampo, "Block 123," yoyo, marbles or jolens, text, and other games with their friends. Others would bring an occasional Voltes 5 action robot while on recess and lunch break. Eventually, the toys we played with would be upgraded to He-Man, GI-Joes, Transformers, Voltron, Dungeons and Dragons, Thundercats and Game & Watch. Besides being the unofficial playground of the school, we have fond memories of the Quadrangle, the heart of the campus, wherein we gathered for flag ceremonies, opening prayers, announcements, calisthenics, and other school events. Others may claim that their favorite place at School was the canteen and cafeteria, where one can dine on pork barbecue, sardines pizza, burger, hotdog, taco, chocolate cake, dinuguan, mami, slopao, and other assortment of delicious meals. For those inclined in sports, played basketball at the covered-courts especially during inclement weather, while others preferred a more relaxed and supine time, lying on concrete

benches near the Junior Football Field. Indeed, there are plenty of memories to recall from our time at San Beda College.

With Malacanang Palace and Mendola Bridge near our campus, most of us witnessed the various political turbulence and upheavals of our nation. During class hours, our school would sometimes be disrupted by regnant kerfuffle between riot police versus truculent demonstrators. Although the middle part of the 80's was a morose, tenebrous, challenging, feryd and perilous period in our history, our classes at San Beda persisted. Our education endured even in the occurrence of natural calamities: the powerful typhoon that toppled three of the Quadrangle's age-old trees, the deadly July 16, 1990 earthquake that fractured cracks to certain walls and floors, the major eruption on June 12, 1991 of the once quiescent volcano, Mount Pinatubo, inundated our homes and campus with soot and ash. Despite all of these events, nothing deterred us from going to school. These events enhanced our fortitude, courage, dauntlessness and determination as students.

While studying at San Beda, we ascertained knowledge from respectable and erudite educators and teachers. They encouraged us to be diligent and sedulous with our school work, quizzes, projects and exams. They challenged us to refine ourselves in preparation for higher learning in college. They parlayed our God-given talents to emend them so as to explore other hidden talents we possess. In return, they rewarded us with awards, pins, certificates, medals and enthusiastic encouragement. As we learned the basics of language, math, algebra, science, physics, chemistry, geometry, biology, economics, religion, art, music, physical education, history and social studies, our teachers reinforced our Christian way of life as well. Besides learning our ABC's, San Beda cultivated our spiritual growth through our many recollections, and spiritual retreats. Our annual retreat to the retreat house and the placid cenacle of Tagaytay City led us to a personal encounter with Jesus Christ. These retreats served to mellorate our



relationship with our own parents, our siblings, our friends, our neighbors, and most importantly, God.

During High School, everyone had a chance to visit the many depressed areas of Metro Manila through the Immersion Program of the school. We once stopped by at an orphanage, exposing us to the needy and marginalized children of our society. We observed their deplorable and malnourished condition. Baset by poverty and arant destitution, some of the orphaned boys resort to cadging in the obstreperous streets of Quiapo and Luneta Park. We also traveled to a community at the vicinity of the Chinese Cemetery, wherein hundreds of homeless families lived within the shadows of niches, shallow tombs and mausoleums of the buried dead. We conversed with them and heard the stories of their struggle to find a decent home to live in and their search for a respectable way of earning a living. Another trip was to the seaside town of Navotas, wherein scrap wood, corrugated paper, and pieces of metal are fashioned as austere stilted huts. Their houses were in danger of flooding and collapse due to the onslaught of Manila Bay's constant waves and high-tides. We trudged on the turbid ground as we skillfully balanced our way to one of the huts. Looking inside in one of the improvised shack, we beheld eight to ten people crowded together in one tiny space. Collecting trash, salvaging metal and





other useful scraps was the main livelihood of the community. Sadly, most of the children we met do not go to school as most of them accompany their emaciated mothers in the squalid and putrid Smokey Mountain waste dump. Lastly, we spent a week with a volunteer family at Brgy. Wawa in Binangonan, Rizal. For a week we ate what our host family served, slept where they slept, and went to the bathroom where they relieved themselves. As young men, we realized how fortunate we were, having parents able to provide for us warm shelter, good food and a loving home to live in. We discovered how privileged we were of having a good education from San Beda. Seeing the travails of our neediest neighbors amid the dross and desiccated landscape evoked in us empathy and compassion towards the less-fortunate, the indigent, the impecunious members of our society and especially our own countrymen. Our laconic time with the poor taught us about social justice, appreciation of our own blessings, and a clarion call to action to help and uplift our fellowmen.

Indeed, 25 years has passed since we accomplished our goal of graduating from High School. We are proud of our individual success as a professional in the field we chose. Some of us have achieved great and excellent deeds in life. Some of us have traveled to the far reaches of our planet and beyond the depths of oceans. One thing is evident about us: "Once a Bedan, always a Bedan." We should be thankful to God for all the graces and blessings we have received. Moreover, we are indebted to all our former advisers, instructors, faculty members, educators and priests because of their assiduous guidance and forbearance. We should be thankful to our parents

especially for their love, support and financial sacrifices. Lastly, as we celebrate the happy occasion of this Grand Alumni Homecoming and our common and lasting fellowship, let us

remember our departed priests, teachers, fellow classmates and batchmates. They may no longer be present among us, but they represent our contingent of Bedans in Heaven. This article is dedicated to all of you. Continue to appreciate one another and the legacy of our school. Remain faithful in our Christian upbringing, glorifying God in whatever task we do. As we persevere in our journey in life, my hope is that we never lose the Bedan in our identity and our character. That when others meet and know us, they will attest with pellucidity and honesty that we are Bedans. **UT IN OMNIBUS GLORIFICETUR DEUS.**

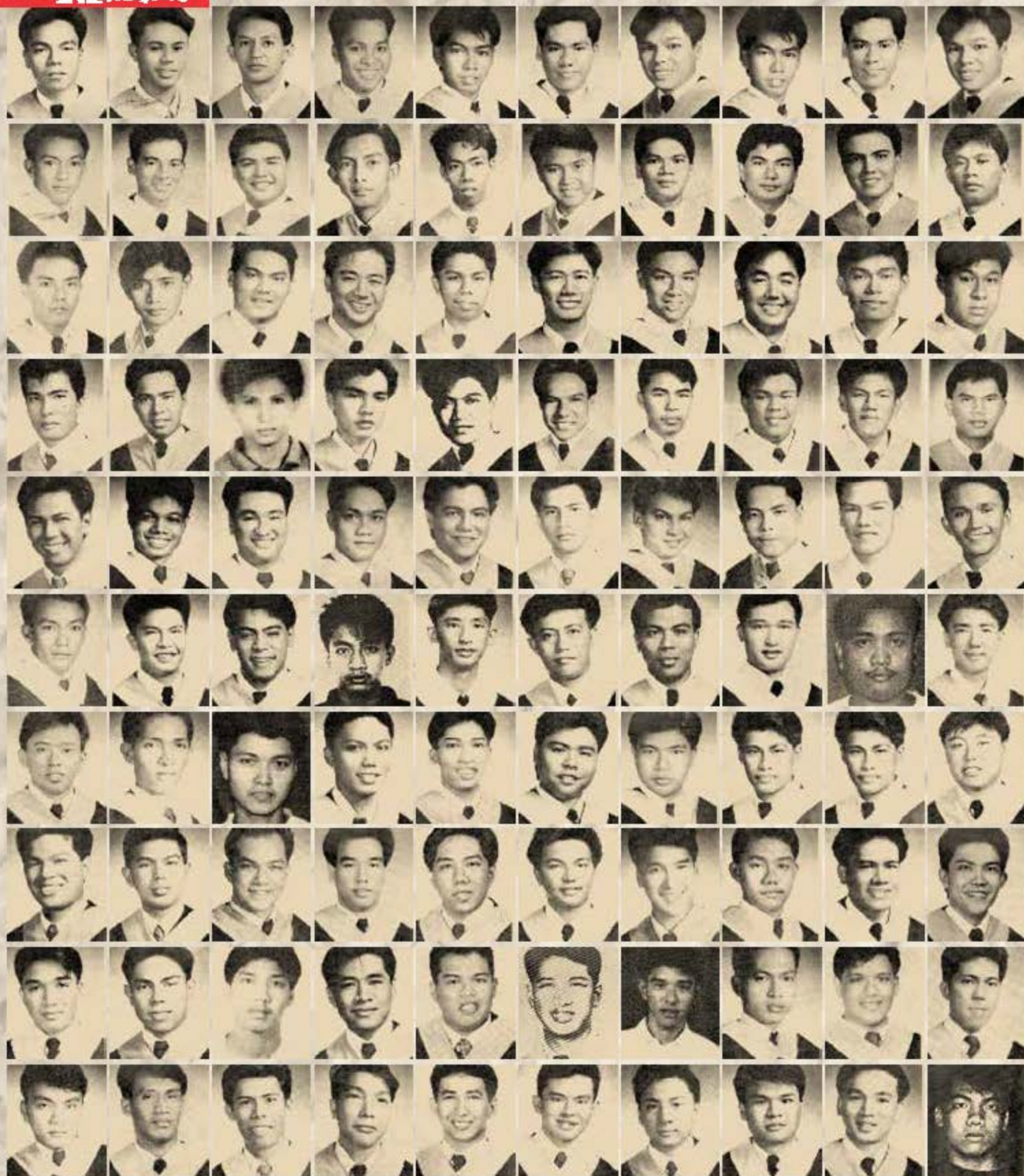

LASTING REFORMS: OUR BIGGEST ROAR

It was a pleasant surprise when I was informed that we are the Jubiliarians this year. Has it been 25 years since we donned our robes, and playfully marched to receive our diplomas as San Beda College graduates? It does not seem that long since we banged on our computers for weeks using Wordstar (or was it Wordperfect?) to finish our "thesis" on the last day for submission. When I had to bravely, but elatedly, cross enroll in the all-girls La Consolacion College to pass my 'incomplete' grade in Spanish. Or swallow whole Mang Roger's balot for dinner or gobble up tapsilog during lunch breaks at the "hole in the whole" kiosks that line up the Bedan walls then. Or those many solrees with "St. Scho" girls when Beda was still an "all boys" club. It doesn't seem to be that long ago.

As fresh graduates all of us faced the world then full of hope that after years of ora et labore under the stern gaze of our very strict English teacher, the colorful Bible stories of our Theology professor, the until-now-incomprehensible programming lectures of our Computer teacher and the fearful feeling every time we are called to the office of Dom Clement Roque, after all these stressful but fun years of study, we were free to roam the world and bid for success.

Some of us immediately launched into their respective careers, and worked on their fields in Economics, Accounting, Management and Philosophy the only courses offered in San Beda then. Others like me, trudged on a little longer, and went to law school. Armed with the Bedan principle of Faith, Knowledge and Virtues, many of us led successful lives, whether in business or politics. Perhaps, the dictum of work and prayers, hammered into our minds through our Bedan years, coupled with the determination and courage of our Red Lions, worked very well in propelling us to face and hurdle great challenges in life. Whatever small successes that came my way as a member of Congress, come largely from that Bedan motto deeply inculcated on us during those important college years—Faith, Knowledge and Virtues.

It was a lonely battle when, in 2011, I filed the bill to Increase SSS pension. But Faith and the never say die spirit of our Red Lions in many championship fights probably inspired me to persist despite the

Former Bayan Muna Congressman Neri Colmenares entered San Beda in 1987 and finished his AB Economics in 1992. He was given the Distinguished Bedan Award in 2013 for 'Exemplary Government Service'. He was an Associate at the Asian Law Center when he was taking his Law PhD at the University of Melbourne. He was the Senior Deputy Minority Leader of the 16th Congress and authored the original SSS pension bill. He has been an advocate for social pension and tax reforms for years with bills to increase pension, lower income tax and eliminate VAT in gasoline, water and electricity charges. odds until one day all our work bore fruit with Pres. Rodrigo Duterte's bold approval of the pension increase. I never thought that my bill requiring government to send text messages containing disaster warnings, evacuation places and schedule of relief operations would ever become a law. But faith and a recognition that a law that tries to save lives during calamities is worth fighting for, in the end gave birth to RA 10639 or the Free Mobile Alerts Disaster Act. It may be difficult to pass a bill in Congress, but *ora et labore*, helped me craft ten laws during my stint in Congress including the Anti-Torture Law and the Human Rights Compensation Law.

I almost did not file HB 5401, which aimed to lower our unjust personal income tax charges, because of the voluminous studies that have to be undertaken in relation to income tax reforms. But St. Benedict's drive for education and 'knowledge' as an important component of whatever we do, inspired me to burn that extra candle to analyze how unjustly we have been overtaxed for years. And fight for tax reform during the last Congress. I am very sure that this battle ends this year when our income tax rates, unchanged since 1997, will be justly reduced under the current administration.

Virtue, ah, this one escaped me for years, as I grappled with the question as to what kind of virtue did our Benedictine tradition primarily want to imbue on us, only to realize that it has been staring at me all along. It has been there in the camaraderie of Batch 92 during those memorable college years, it was there in our jubilant cheers and jeers during heated championship fights, and that sense of Bedan belonging that lingers long after graduation and re-lived during alumni homecomings—the love for the Bedan community and our people.

I guess this virtue of love for and service to our people is what guided me through all those battles against corruption and abuse during my Congress years, and in the struggle for reforms in our society. Faith, knowledge, virtues, those difficult but important learnings that Bedans cannot and must not forget especially now, that Bedans wield the power to govern this country.

Never before in history are Bedans given the opportunity to bring about lasting changes and reforms in our society and unshackle our people from the chains of corruption, crime and eternal poverty. The President of the Republic is a Bedan and many in the corridors of power are Bedans. Faith, knowledge, virtues, *ora et labore* helped shape the lives of Bedans. Bedans are now in a position to help shape the lives of our people and change the destiny of this nation. Let us depart from tradition, be different and make a difference. This will be our loudest roar, a roar that will resonate throughout our country and heard through the years. Change was promised and change shall come. Roar pa more!

Reverend Father Paul Ma. De Vera, Officers and Members of the San Beda College Alumni Foundation, Friends,

I have been asked to say a few words on behalf of the family in response to this tree planting ceremony and the installation of a commemorative marker in memory of your fellow Bedan.

When I was asked to do this, I felt that whatever I say would not sufficiently convey my dad's feelings about this event. Obviously, it would have been more satisfying and meaningful if he were the one who personally responded to this honor. Unfortunately, he passed away 8 months ago, less than a year after he found out that he had cancer. Needless to say, the family was devastated and we miss him a lot.

Since my dad cannot be physically present with us today, I thought maybe I should try to imagine what his feelings would be and what he would say about what we are doing today.

First of all, I think he would reaffirm his great love for San Beda and how much his two years in San Beda helped provide him the solid foundation for his business career as well as for his personal growth. It appears that he had a great time in San Beda because he often talked about how much fun he had there. He was a provinciano, but San Beda took care of him as an intern. He learned a lot from his professors, something he never got tired of narrating to us. He also said San Beda was not all about hitting the books and studying all the time, but about acquiring new friends and partying, including meeting girls from nearby schools. I believe San Beda was also instrumental in reinforcing certain values which guided him throughout his adult

life. Values such as having a positive attitude towards work, leading by example and having high ethical standards in business dealings, including being fair in dealings with his customers, his employees and society in general and government in particular. I know he was eternally grateful to San Beda for this.

In addition, I know he would express his sincere thanks to everybody who has been part of this event today, whether present or not, as he had done so when San Beda conferred upon him an honorary degree some years ago. At that time, he said that he would cherish forever the fact that San Beda was so kind to him as to bestow on him an honorary doctorate degree. He said at that time "Never did I think that I, who was not able to finish college, and who does not even have a Bachelor Degree or a Master's Degree would be conferred a Doctorate Degree. I accept this degree with sincere gratitude and humility. I hope that I can live up to the responsibilities that receiving such a degree entails. In addition, I would like to pay tribute to the many who are not present here today: my parents, my professors, the people that have worked with me all these years, my friends, my business associates, our customers. Without their guidance and support, I know that I would not be standing here in front of you today." I know if he were here today, he would also have said something similar. Definitely, he would have been extremely happy and would have thanked you from the bottom of his heart.

In closing, I know Dad always wanted to make a difference with his life and to contribute to the advancement of society thru his participation in the business sector. Not one to heap praise on himself, he went about doing this every day of his life until he passed away to the best of his ability, persistently and without fanfare. For him, he was just doing his duty to be a positive influence. I think if he were here today, he would encourage us to take up our own challenges, to live a productive and happy life, and to focus our efforts not only on ourselves but also on the betterment of others. He was not an outwardly religious person, but we all know he had a deep faith in God's Providence and was thankful for all the good things that he attained in life. He knew too that his good fortune necessitated the obligation of looking out for others, and to contribute to the greater good.

We have San Beda to thank for making Dad the person he was. He lives on in us and we pray that he would watch over us every day of our lives and inspire us to live the values he was taught and lived as a Bedan.

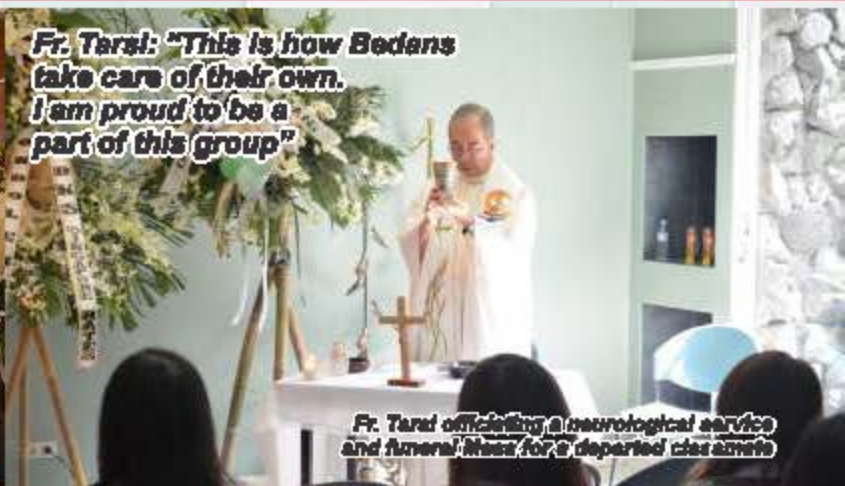

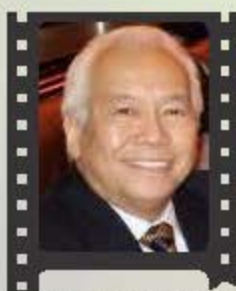

The program itself felt like a lot of blood sweat and tears was spent on the part of the organizers, kibitzers and of course the patrons and supporters.

The night was so aptly and Bedanly orchestrated by Jake Tolosa, Joey Mendoza, and Ed Favila. Meaning there were the usual barbs and jabs wherever appropriate, and words of wisdom from time to time. Meanwhile, the spinner Jules dela Fuente did his part to provide the audio and the video for optimum impact.

We were honored by the presence of Fr. Ed Africa, who did not seem to age much (another Fr. Banabarra in the making?), and of course some of the gracious wives who joined us.

Amidst the amplified songs of our times, the catching up done with each other, and the gems and hidden stories of our Batch driven and revealed by the "San Beda 67/71 Trivia" game we played - I thought to myself - I wish these guys would live forever.

Then came the part to sing the Bedan hymns and songs, and cheer the Bedan cheers: "The Red and The White. The Indian Yell. The Alma Mater Hymn. Go San Beda Fight!..."

I never heard these old familiar songs rendered with so much force and passion. From the stage, one could see every single one of our brothers, belting out those lyrics with fire and power. And yes - I did catch some teary eyed ones too.

The evening wore off and most of the boys stayed on. Kuwentuhan, kantahan (Mark Migallio belting out "Twist and Shout") kanchawan, catching-up. Tawanan.

Some with pot bellies, some with grey or white hair, some with walking sticks, some even with rippling muscles (@#%!!) - whatever time altered in these band of brothers, time failed to change one thing - and that's - Bedans will always be Bedans.

Ask any Bedan... and he will tell you what that means! "May their fellowship never cease"



The Bedan: A Short History

The date was October 31, 1941

In the United States, the completion of the Mount Rushmore National Memorial was just announced. In the waters of the Atlantic, near Iceland, USS Reuben James was hit

by a torpedo attack from a German U-boat, the first American ship to be sunk in World War II, even before America entered the said war.

And in Manila, a new publication for and by the students of San Beda College released its maiden issue. It was a 12-page, five-column affair, printed by letterpress process on glazed newsprint, with its own birth as the main story. *"The Bedan Replaces Ecos as Student Organ,"* the banner headline blared.

Five weeks later, World War II began.

After only three issues, the Bedan ceased publication, the emerging voice of the student body abruptly silenced by World War II. When Manila fell to the Japanese Imperial Army, the San Beda college campus was taken over by the occupation forces. It was to be used as the Japanese forces headquarters and depot.

Fr. Boniface Axtman, the school's American Rector who was instrumental in the establishment of The Bedan, was sent to the UST Internment camp, and later, to UP Los Baños, along with three other American priests.

San Beda continued to operate during the Japanese occupation, but The Bedan resumed publishing only on September 12, 1945, six months after the liberation of Manila, and on the occasion of the 50th year of the Benedictine Mission in the Philippines.

It was The Bedan's "second spring, after the chilling winter of the last four years of war," wrote Fr. Eladio

De Juan, OSB, Prior of the Benedictine Community of San Beda College, in his welcome message.

From then on, The Bedan continued to grow and flourish through the 50s and 80s, its pages filled with elegant writing that, sometimes, even proved prophetic. By the start of the 1970s, social, political and economic issues were heating up to boiling point.

The Bedan responded with a more nationalistic and progressive tone in its articles. On September 21, 1972, President Ferdinand Marcos declared Martial Law. The next day, he issued Letter of Instruction number 1, which led to the closure of all newspapers and magazines, including student publications. Once again, historical turmoil silenced The Bedan, if but briefly.

It was revived in 1975, in the shadow of the dictatorship perched on the other end of Mendiola. Rev Fr. Eduardo Africa, OSB wrote in his message *"...after a two-year hiatus and in view of a changed political situation in the country, new objectives have to be considered and formulated, a new spirit has to be created."*

The Bedan resumed its role as chronicler of campus affairs and concerns, and the voice of the student body.

But each time the clarion called, The Bedan was there to answer.

It would also be challenged by internal forces, but it soldiered on, refusing to be silenced once more.

The words by Fr. Boniface Axtman 75 years ago still resonate to this day: The noble work of its founders and those who have labored on its staff from year to year will always be spoken of with pride.



The Bedan 75th Celebration

Anniversaries and homecomings bring back memories of years long ago. The friends we made and the times we had together. The Bedan 75th celebrations are not any different. It speaks of tradition and courage. It speaks of commitments to a cause and the willingness to speak out. We were the young budding journalists-to-be raring to make our mark in San Beda, the community and the country. We chose The Bedan, or maybe The Bedan chose us.

It speaks of the times we stressed over deadlines and where we could get that quick meal because we had to go back to the printing press. Of the coffee we lived on, sometimes cold and stale yet gratifying in a way, together with that cigarette hanging from our lips dropping ashes on the paper in the typewriter (I guess this image no longer applies as smoking has been banned in so many places and by the fact that I've quit several years ago) and spending more time just to get the next line for that inspiring editorial. Or the reams of

newsprint we wasted just to get the perfect first line of the headline story. (Thank God for computers, I don't feel as guilty now as more trees don't have to die when I have to do a restart.) I remember our advisers at the time, led by Atty. Dante Q. Barbosa, who

was also one of the outstanding editors that The Bedan has produced, Tess Arcadio-Magsaysay, who was the first female faculty adviser and who later migrated to the US, and the late Fr. Pio Lomibao OSB, who pinched hit sometimes as adviser and had control of The Bedan's purse strings.

And those were the times, which we remember vividly. We challenged authority because we could. We covered the rallies on Mendiola, but participated in it as well. We did not sit back and just be observers to history. We challenged the norms and made our point emphatically. We took sides on issues of the day, whether it was about school policies or national issues. Our roles were significant and we made ourselves relevant, many of us at the forefront.

The Bedan beckoned as the organization to be in as I entered college in 1976. From San Beda High School, where I was editor in chief for The Cub Recorder, The Bedan was the most logical choice. Martial Law was declared four years earlier in 1972 and took guarded steps in order to maintain the paper's presence in the community. That first year as staffer, we were only able to publish in the first semester as we were suspended as a paper in the second term for not showing the blue

print before releasing the last issue.

The following year we were back in business, Iboy Pinga was editor. This was the year when San Beda ended the NCAA senior basketball championship drought. On my third year I was appointed editor

in chief. Louie San Juan, our photo and news editor was elected chairman of the revived College Editors Guild Metro Manila Chapter.

The lessons learned from The Bedan goes beyond the classroom. It transcended our textbooks and

expanded our horizons to national issues. To go beyond theory and apply what we learned in class. We didn't compromise principles but learned to manage expectations. Four years in The Bedan meant sacrifices but it also had its rewards. An experience that I'd do all over again.

The editors of the 80s and 90s led by Manny Mas and Ares Gutierrez among others spearheaded the idea of an alumni association for The Bedan. We first came together in the middle of 2015, with younger editors and staff of years past coming home in preparation for the 75th celebration. That Saturday, when the editors and staff met again, was filled with surprises. Some were unrecognizable, as either we gained weight over the years, or had more white hair than black, or not much hair left. It was a time to remember the good times and the bad, but certainly the bond was there, even perhaps stronger than ever.

It was a great time to organize The Bedan's alumni association. Past editors were there, Manny Mas, Ares Gutierrez, Weewee Raz, Ruel Ramirez, Jeff Darol, Porky Porcalla, JG Matibag, and whole lot more which my memory can't remember since I seemed to be the most senior at the time of the meeting, with all due respect to Atty. Rene Saguisag, our chairman emeritus. Of course, I have to mention The Bedan's first female editor, Danna Katrina Padilla Lim who has been one of the group's reliable pillars. And I think was followed by at least seven lady editors in chief, with Maureen Dulas as this year's incumbent.

The actual organization was flexible and we had people coming in all throughout the year. Projects were planned and we set up the assignments. Committees formed for the specific areas for the coming celebrations. We met on weekends and sometimes reminisced about old times. But there were more times when we'd talk about the issues of the day. Projects are lined up related to the publication, with the digitization of all The Bedan issues since October 1941 as a premiere activity. Other projects include a coffee table book focusing on The Bedan through the years and updates to The Bedan Stylebook.

At the end of the day, we all agreed that The Bedan Alumni association would have the following objectives:

- Provide a venue for former editors and staff of The Bedan to meet and exchange ideas
- Pursue that The Bedan be the official publication of the school
- Assist the current staff with activities to enhance their capabilities
