



WHO REALLY FOUNDED

The Bedan ALUMNUS?

If you have been regularly and attentively reading the issues of *The Bedan Alumnus*, you would find inside the title box of this official publication, the caption "*Third Epoch founded 1962 by Rev. Fr. Benigno Benabarre, OSB*". This line was added upon my request shortly after I was appointed SBCAA moderator in 2004.



But who was really the founder of this alumni publication? In my research, the late distinguished Bedan **Atty. Dante Q. Barbosa (AB '57, LIB'60)** explained that the origins of our magazine were really the group of prominent alumni, who met in the restaurant *Ambos Mundos* in 1959: **Ramon "Mon" Santiago (BCS'54)**, **Benjamin "Benni" Rosello (BCS'56)**, **Raul I. Contreras (HS'56, AB'60)**, **Rafael "Peng" Velez (AB'57, LIB'60)**, **Antonlo Y. Capay (HS'53, BCS'57)**, **Atty. Dante Barbosa** and the late **Honorable Estelita "Esty" Juco**, the only female SBCAA "*honorary alumna*". The maiden issue of *The Bedan Alumnus* came out on March 8, 1959, just in time for the homecoming.

I surmise that *The Bedan Alumnus* fathered by the alumni group who met in the restaurant *Ambos Mundos* in 1959, had a short life and was not published quarterly; and that shortly after I was appointed Rector on May 1961, I felt that as Rector, I have to give the magazine new, better and permanent life.

I rest my case!

Remaining Faithful in Devoting Life to the Eucharist

(Homily of Rev. Fr. Austin P. Cadiz, OSB during the Eucharistic Celebration on the Occasion of the 50th Anniversary of the Ordination to Priesthood of Rt. Rev. Fr. Tarcisio Ma. H. Narciso, OSB)

Very Rev. Fr. Rafaelito Alaras, our Prior Administrator, Very Rev. Fr. Savio Siccuan, Pro-Visitator of the Philippine Pro-Province of the Subiaco Cassinese Congregation, Rt. Rev. Abbot Eduardo Africa, Rt. Rev. Filomeno Cinco, my fellow concelebrants, my brother monks, fellow religious, family and friends of the Rt. Rev. Abbot-Emeritus Tarcisio Ma. Narciso, guests, my brothers and sisters in Christ:

In one of the church's I visited, there was an inspiring reminder for priests which was displayed in the sacristy just below the crucifix that says: "O Priest of God, celebrate this Mass as if it was your first Mass, as if it was your last Mass, as if it was your only Mass." These words can be applied to all of us not only to priests. Today, we are invited to celebrate with our Father, Abbot Tarsi, this Thanksgiving Mass and to pray with him fervently as if this Mass is our first, our last, and our only Mass.

Since my early formation years in the monastic life, to this day, I have always been inspired by the way Fr. Abbot Tarcisio celebrates the Mass. He inspires us with a certain kind of devotion and piety. There is a deep sense of reverence and gratitude for what is happening in the celebration, a sign of deep intimacy with the Lord. He celebrates the Mass as though it is his first Mass, his only Mass, and last Mass.

When he was in grade school, Abbot Tarsi was part of the group of altar servers who had a devotion to St Tarcisius – an early century martyr of the Eucharist. St. Tarcisius had a profound love for the eucharist. In fact, he died a martyr protecting the Eucharist from being desecrated. St. Tarcisius is the patron of altar servers. The group of altar servers where Abbot Tarsi was a member celebrated Vigils before the Blessed Sacrament as part of their formation and because of this he developed a deep love





for the Eucharist. When Abbot Tarsi entered the Abbey in Manila, he asked that his monastic name would be in honor of St Tarcisius and the Blessed Virgin Mary. True to the spirituality of his patron saint, for 50 years, he has remained faithful in devoting his life to the Eucharist as a monk and priest.

There is an ancient title often given to priests: *"alter Christus"* (another Christ). Cardinal Basil Hume, OSB explains it this way: *"At Mass, the sacrifice of Christ is re-enacted and made present, and the priest takes the place of Christ himself, who is indeed also the victim."* At the celebration of the Eucharist the priest indeed stands as *"another Christ."*

How difficult and heavy the responsibility to act and speak in the name of Jesus Christ is. And yet, the gospel

tells us of this responsibility that we all must bear, each in his or her own vocation. For the priest, he is to speak in the name of God and to act as *"another Christ"* – a very difficult, if not an impossible, task! How much more difficult it is to faithfully proclaim the Word of God by our life! But by the grace of God – all things are possible! Our Holy Father St. Benedict in his Holy Rule constantly reminds us of this *"dura et aspera"*, the "rough and rugged" path of monastic life, and at the same time, consoles us with words of wisdom when he writes: *"What is not possible to us by nature, let us ask the Lord to supply by the help of His grace (Prol 41)."*

I remember a story about a guest who stayed in the monastery for a couple of days for a silent retreat. One day while walking along the cloister, he saw an old monk and after greeting him, politely asked: *"Brother, what do*



you do here in the monastery?" The wise monk, after reflecting on the question, said in reply: *"What we do here in the monastery is we rise and we fall, we rise and we fall, we rise and we fall."* St Julian of Norwich explains it plainly this way: *"First is the fall, then we recover from the fall, both are the mercy of God."*

Today's celebration is an invitation to rise again, with the risen Christ, to new life – to encounter the God who is merciful and who loves us unconditionally in Christ, the High Priest. As our reading from the letter to the Hebrews says: *"Let us confidently approach the throne of grace to receive mercy and to find grace for timely help."* Today is a time for personal and community renewal in our covenant relationship with God. Today is a time for healing and experiencing mercy and forgiveness in one another for the love of Christ. Our community and our families are made stronger by mercy and love, as we rise from every fall. Indeed, today is a sacred time to give thanks to God, for sending us His only Son, Jesus Christ, the High Priest, who, as our reading says, sympathizes with our weaknesses and has been tested in every way, yet without sin.

This solemn monastic celebration of the golden jubilee of our beloved Abbot-emeritus Abbot Tarcisio is a proclamation of God's faithfulness and generosity, of God's mercy and compassion, of God's constant love – not only to Abbot Tarsi, but to all of us whose lives he has touched in his ministry of winning souls to God! God

continues to fulfill His promises to us, that He will always be faithful. And today, God will manifest His love and nourish us again in this Eucharist in which He gives His very life for our salvation. Let us thank God for the gift of the priesthood and for the gift of monastic life.

Our Benedictine community of the Abbey of Our Lady of Montserrat, Manila celebrates, this year, 120 years of monastic presence in the Philippines and Asia. At this table of the Lord, God continues to pour out His Holy Spirit upon us and bless us with His grace and mercy. In this same place, fifty years ago, Abbot Tarsi celebrated his first Mass.

Abbot Tarsi, thank you for being a true presence of Christ in the midst of us, your monastic community. May you continue to bring Christ to others and be a source of inspiration and perseverance to us all, especially to us young monks as we journey together towards eternal life in Heaven.



SBLAA CHAIRMAN ATTY. AVELINO V. CRUZ

First Filipino President of the ASEAN Law Association

Atty. Avelino V. Cruz, the incumbent Chairman of the San Beda Law Alumni Association and recipient of Bedan Outstanding Alumni and Hall of Fame Awards, as well as "Bedan of the Century Award 2002", was unanimously elected President for a term of 3 years of the region-wide ten country ASEAN Law Association (ALA) at its 12th ALA General Assembly in Manila last March 4, 2015. He succeeds outgoing ALA President, Chief Justice Dr. Hatta Ali of Indonesia.

At the time of his election, Mr. Cruz was Chairman of the ALA Philippine National Committee, whose new Chairman is (Ret) Chief Justice Artemio Panganiban. Mr. Cruz is also the first former Secretary General of the Association to assume the ALA presidency and he was an established leader of the ALA Governing Council for many years. Under the ALA Constitution, Mr. Cruz as President is Chief Executive and Chairman and will preside over the ALA General Assembly and its Governing Council, whose current members include ASEAN Chief Justices, Kifrawi Kifli of Brunei, Hatta Ali of Indonesia, Tun Arifin of Malaysia, Sundaresh Menon of Singapore and Direk Ingkaninanda of Thailand. Other members are Vietnam's Dr. Prof. Le Minh Tam, Cambodia's Justice You Ottara, Lao PDR's Justice Khampha Sengdara and Myanmar's Attorney General Kyaw San. Philippine Chief Justice Maria Lourdes Sereno sits in the ALA Governing Council. Philippine Senate President Franklin Drilon serves as Chairman of the ALA Foundation and Atty. Regina Geraldez, its Treasurer will serve as the new ALA Secretary General.

Mr. Cruz obtained his Bachelors Degree (L.B.'61) magna cum laude and valedictorian from San Beda



College of Law. He obtained his Master of Laws (L.M.) in 1964 from the University of Michigan Law School, was a Ford Fellow at the University of California, and was recipient of the US Fulbright-Hayes and Dewitt Fellowships. In the 1961 with a Special Permit from the Philippine Supreme Court to take the Philippine Bar Exams, at age 20, he obtained first place with a grade of 90.95% over a field of 4,395 candidates, the youngest bar topnotcher in Philippine history.

Mr. Cruz taught Law at San Beda from 1962 to 1974. From 1981 to 1984, he was lecturer at the U.P. and taught "International Business Transactions". In 1986, following the EDSA revolution, as Deputy Prime Minister to the late Vice President & Prime Minister Salvador Laurel, he served as Chairman of the Working Committee composed of then Deputy Justice Minister, (later Chief Justice) Reynato Puno, and Solicitor (later Justice) Minerva Reyes, as members, which drafted the "Freedom Constitution", and which governed the Philippines from March, 1986 until February 1987.

The new ALA President is Founding Partner of the prestigious ACCRA Law Office and is one of the country's leading authority on public utilities and energy laws. Mr. Cruz has served in the Boards among others of Mobil Oil and Petron, PLDT, Philippine Airlines, Philippine National Bank (L.A.), Phil. Bank of Commerce and Associated Bank. Currently he is Chairman of the Hawaiian Airlines (Philippines) and serves in Isla Gas (Shell) of Guam. In 2002, he was elected centennial President of the prestigious Manila Golf & Country Club.

Mr. Cruz, for many years, was an established leader of the Philippine Integrated Bar and other Bar Societies. He is recognized by Chambers Asia Pacific in 2012 as "one of Asia's leading practitioners in corporate acquisitions, mergers and disputes", and is the first Filipino (and the first of only 2 Asians) ever invited to membership by the prestigious American Law Institute, the US Supreme Court think-tank. In 2012, Mr. Cruz was conferred Honorary Membership in the China Law Society's Huan Yu China/ASEAN Legal Cooperation Council.

He was voted the Philippines "Most Outstanding Legal Practitioners" by the Consumers Union of the Philippines.

Mr. Cruz is a composer of institutional and love songs, and has rendered piano concerts. He composed the official ALA Anthem approved by the ALA Governing Council in 2005. He is married to the former Helen Canave with whom he has four children, Nerissa, Franz, Tricia and Mary Rosalyn.

The issue of Grace's qualification should be for the people to decide, as a quintessential political question. As **Justice Isagani R. Cruz** wrote, "*where the matter falls under the discretion of . . . especially the people themselves, the [matter] is in the category of a political question and consequently may not be the subject of judicial review.*" Questions to be decided by the people themselves in their sovereign capacity, by voters as particles of popular sovereignty.

Let the sovereign people decide who will lead us in 2016-2022, via a majoritarian or even pluralistic verdict.

Erap told me in a recent (*Sept. 27*)

dinner of 1987-92 Senators that under certain scenarios, he may run himself. I asked: Would Grace's unlikely but possible disqualification be one such context? His eyes moistened at mention of the Restoration suggestion or possibility. He did say before that should he return to the Palace, he would serve only for the time of which he was deprived of the presidency (*three and a half years*) by the Supreme Court thru its own, magisterial jiu-jitsu or power grab. (*Me, to come back as Senator? Di na nga makalakad, tatakbopa?*)

Let the sovereign people, not the nine-member SET or the 15-member SC, decide this political, not purely legal, question.

First President of the San Beda College Alumni Association

The Bedan Alumnus is happy to publish for the first time the photo of its first President Don Angel Macapinlac I Balmori (1923-24). After much searching, it was one of his grandchildren who gave this picture to us.

San Beda College Alumni Association was founded in the year 1923 by a group of 40 alumni who met for three times to prepare the by-Laws of the SBCAA, which was finally approved in their fourth meeting on the 22 of June, 1923.

In that meeting, the first SBCAA board of trustees was elected: President, Sr. Angel Macapinlac; Vice President, Dr. Jose Siar; Secretary, Miguel Artigas; and Treasurer, Manuel Casas; Directors: Federico Calero, Carlos Preysler, Antonio Ayesa and Ricardo Sikat.

The first homecoming took place on February 1923, at which about 80 alumni were present. The gathering was honoured by the presence of the Apostolic Delegate, Msgr. Guillermo Piani and a representative of the Rector of the Santo Tomas.

The SBCAA has had ups and downs in its long history of existence. The alumni have three independent associations, serving as partners in the school's mission of Benedictine education: San Beda College Alumni Association, San Beda Law Alumni Association and San Beda College Alumni Foundation.

Remembering Fr. Peter Celestine Say, OSB (1928-2015)

The Very Rev. Fr. Rafaelito Alaras, OSB, Prior Administrator of our Benedictine Community and I received an e-mail from the USA announcing the peaceful death of Rev. Fr. Celestine Say, OSB last August 4, feast of St. John Vianney, Patron of Parish Priests. His demise came as a surprise because no previous notice of sickness was received by the Community in Manila, Philippines.

Fr. Say was born in Manila from non-Catholic parents on March 28, 1928. He was given the name John Joseph T. Say, Jr.

John enrolled in our SBC High School in 1945, and obtained a bachelor's degree in Commerce, major in Banking and Finance, in 1960 in the CAS.

As a Benedictine monk

So attracted to the monastic life, of the members of the Abbey community he observed for eight years, Fr. Say entered the Community and began the novitiate in the year 1952, the moment he was given the name of Peter Celestine. He made the simple profession the following year, and was ordained priest on March 21, 1958.

Fr. Say held various school positions, namely: Superintendent of the College grounds, Grade School Principal and Head Librarian from 1963-1965, and professor.

As member of the Benedictine Community, he was appointed to the high position of Prior-Administrator on March 2, 1968 by Abbot Gabriel Brasó, President the Benedictine Congregation of Subiaco.

As a Secular Priest

Due to the somewhat turbulent situation within the Philippine Benedictine Congregation in the mid-'60s and '70s, Fr. Say decided to request the Holy See for the dispensation of his vows. He became a secular priest in America, settled in Hallettsville and, Victoria, Texas USA. He was highly admired as parish priest.

As it could not be otherwise, being such a good person, he maintained his cordial relationship with our College and Abbey, which later entrusted to him some delicate business matters. We will miss, Fr. Say.

We must affirm our hope that there will still be people like him who will come not only from his generation but also from those who are still young, and from those who are still to be born.

The Distinguished Arthur Macapagal Professorial Chair in Business and Economics which the family established in San Beda College in 2005 will surely keep his Bedan spirit alive.

Honorable Florenz D. Regalado A Salute to a Great Bedan

Homily of Rev. Fr. Pio Lomibao, OSB. during the Holy Mass for the eternal repose of the soul of Justice Florenz Regalado

Today's young Bedans may not know that the first footprints of excellence in the life of the San Beda College of Law was drawn by **Florenz D. Regalado** whose phenomenal performance in the 1954 Bar exams has since made him a Bedan Icon, which students should emulate for inspiration. Florenz did not only top the Bar in 1954, he established a record which has not been equaled in the history of the Bar examinations. Florenz was first with a grade of 96.7%. No other successful Bar examinee from any law school anywhere in the country has inched up closer to that of Florenz.

In fact, this landmark achievement in the Bar examinations of Florenz who graduated magna cum laude Class '54 defined the San Beda College of Law as a center of excellence in legal education.

What added texture to the phenomenal performance of the College of Law in the 1954 Bar examinations was the pervasive sense of hope in a bright future for all under a regime a good governance personified by Ramon Magsaysay. The beloved leader of the nation had such a passion for justice for ordinary people that his signature statement – "Let them who have less in life have more in law!" was often quoted. It was a fitting challenge to the idealism of the generation of Justice Florenz.

Even before the Bar examinations of 1954, Dean Feliciano Ledesma was already certain that San Beda would get the top two slots among that year's successful examinees. He was not sure, however, who between Florenz Regalado and Bobby De La Fuente would land in First Place. He had observed first-hand the photographic memory of both, their gift for analysis and the force and clarity of their reasoning. With all these attributes as a premise, topping the Bar would be a necessary conclusion.

Looking back, the joint achievement of Florenz and Bobby in 1954 has morphed from a story of unequalled success to a legend about excellence through a repetition of the narrative. And legends do not die at all.

The legendary Florenz D. Regalado who hails from Concepcion, Iloilo manifested an advanced intellectual development even as a child. When he was barely five years old, he was allowed to be enrolled in the first grade in elementary school although age seven was required for admission. His academic standing in grade school was such that he qualified to be admitted to the experimental accelerated three-year high school program at the Iloilo Provincial High School. His secondary education was interrupted abruptly by the outbreak of World War II in the Pacific which engulfed the Philippines.

With his veteran's educational benefits together with scholarship grants, Florenz breezed through the preparatory law course and the initial year of the law proper at Far Eastern University. For his second year in law, he moved over from Morayta to Mendiola and enrolled at the San Beda College of Law where he made history in 1954.

For his graduate studies in law, the all-time Bar record holder went to the University of Michigan under a Dewitt Fellowship named after a generous American benefactor C.A. Dewitt who was a prominent member of the American business community in Manila before the Pacific War. He obtained his L.I. M. in 1963.

Shortly after taking his professional oath, the young Ilonggo lawyer started his legal career as technical assistance to the Secretary of Labor. He was also Special Prosecutor for labor cases in the Department of Justice.

As a Bar topper, Atty. Regalado just like Prof. Fernandez before him was given the honor and privilege to join the faculty of the San Beda College of Law. When viewed in the context of years of dedicated teaching, the distinction of being a San Beda law professor is animated more by a sense of duty, by noblesse oblige than by a desire for additional recognition.

It was also in academe that Prof. Regalado carved a niche. Since he started teaching at his alma mater in 1955, Professor Regalado has been an acknowledged authority on Criminal Law

and Remedial Law. In fact, he was a pre-Bar reviewer in both subjects for many years not only in San Beda but also in other law schools.

He served as Dean of the College of Law from 1975 to 1988. He was President of the Philippine Association of Law Schools from 1979 to 1981. He was named Dean Emeritus in 1991 and was conferred the honorary degree of Doctor of Laws in 1998.

For the breadth and depth of his knowledge of laws, Dean Regalado was appointed by the late President Corazon C. Aquino as a member of the 1986 Constitutional Commission to draft the present Charter. His fellow Commissioners were so impressed by his legal wisdom that they endorsed him for appointment to the Supreme Court. He was appointed Associate Justice of the Supreme Court on July 29, 1988.

To the credit of Justice Regalado, the Rules of Civil Procedure and the Rules of Criminal Procedure were revised largely through his efforts as Vice Chairman of the Committee on the Rules of Court. The beneficiaries of the far-sighted revisions are the judges, the prosecutors, the defense lawyers and the clients they represent, the professors and the students of law.

Justice Regalado's Remedial Law Compendium and Criminal Law Conspectus have enriched Philippine legal bibliography.

He retired from the Supreme Court, leaving behind a new paradigm of performance. He had fully adjudicated and disposed all cases assigned to him.

Truly, a string of accomplishments over the years deserves the highest award any living Bedan law alumnus can aspire for. In 2004, the San Beda Law Alumni Association Inc. presented Justice Regalado with the Lifetime Achievement Award.

Today in his death, we lost a great Bedan soul. But in our hearts, he will always be San Beda's greatest gain in heaven.



A ground-breaking ceremony took place in Havila Filinvest last January 11, 2015, and a simple inauguration rite highlighted the 100-year of Fr. Benigno last May 24, 2015.

A huge bust of the well-loved centenary Benedictine executed by Dr. Antonio Raymundo (HS'60) served as a landmark in the Garden. Various species of native trees (Mangkono, Pili Aunasin, Liusin, Tuai, Bagna, Bagnang Pula, etc), carefully chosen and tended by SBCAF's project consultant partner, Ms. Imelda Sarmiento of Hortica Filipina Foundation, Inc., were planted in the garden which Fr. Benigno refers to as an "oasis of prayer and silence".

A MAN FOR A REASON

Growing up as a teenager in the 70s had so much twists and turns that were both exciting and risky. These were the party years for the so-called baby boomers. Adventures then were simple, low tech but required much time to be on the road, to meet new people, see new places and even to imbibe new ideologies.

Martial law was still strongly in the air. Boys wanting to begin leading men's lives realized that was a bit of a struggle as opinions were tested.

Many were looking for role models.

And along the hallways of the San Beda at Mendiola was an all-too-familiar smile that was much welcome but an enigma as well. How could he be such a smiling face, for a priest and our principal at that? It was

martial law. Shouldn't he be more strict and controlling? More out-of-reach and policy-driven?

Now as adults we know he had to be such, but way back then, he chose to be with his students. To show his familiarity, light-heartedness and love towards each of us. Even knowing and calling us by name.

Father Tarsi we would call him. He would look you in the eye when conversing and give you that fatherly and look of genuine interest. A good listener, you would notice his eyebrows raise a bit when listening to you – giving the assurance that he

indeed is trying to understand you as a student. His somewhat frail frame, hidden underneath his cassock would give him an advantage after all – that of being agile and be able to quickly give a student a tap or a gentle nudge of candor.

I had my share of these with Fr. Tarsi. He would ask about how the last weekend's party was. Or say with a slightly-bent head, "what happened to you?" once he would see you tired or limping from a sport-related injury. Even if he had his arms folded, students would not hesitate to go near him and strike a conversation or wait to be greeted. He was a lovable figure, not feared but respected.



The years moved on, and fast. I somehow lost track of him even while I spent my college years in San Beda and moreso after college where the real life of work and family started taking over. Not until the years that we began coming back to Mendiola – and found that Fr Tarsi was still there and now in the thick of higher responsibilities for the school, having served as Rector-President, and then as Abbot.

43 years after , the words by which I could describe Fr. Tarsi is still much relevant and resounding. Go down the halls of Mendiola today and you will still see this figure, this smile, this light heart and gentle soul. Still looking young, still looking to warm hearts.

At some corner in the school are trophies, emblems of achievements, new structures that symbolize new academic competencies. But at the core of these is what founds San Beda. Men of integrity, compassion and inspiration.

Thank you Fr. Tarsi for being these to us. May you live long and healthy and loved as you have done so.


