





In memory of the late outstanding Bedan **Capt. Gregorio S. Oca**, the Distinguished Professorial Chair on Labor Relations will be launched soon in SBC-CAS. Thanks to son **Dr. Conrad Oca** and family members for putting up this professorial chair to honor the memory of our former SBCAA president. We hope that the Oca family will also serve as an example to all Bedans who may wish to support this academic program aimed at further enhancing the quality of instructions in the College.

The SBCAF will soon be planting native trees along NLEX from KM 27 (after Bocaue exit) to KM 88 (after Dau toll plaza). To date, Bedans and friends have already planted native trees at KM12 to KM27. The SBCAF is targeting 57,000 native trees for NLEX, north bound. Our country has 3,600 native trees species; 67% are found ONLY in our country (endemic). Natural biodiversity affords a clear environment, which can translate to a healthier people and society. And native trees are the stalwarts of natural biodiversity. However, we realize that native trees are endangered in the Philippines and biodiversity has been severely compromised. The time has come to bring biodiversity back and the SBCAF is supporting this advocacy undertaking through its TREEathlon at NLEX project.

The Department of Education and the SBCAF will soon become partners in a National Greening Program (NGP). The NGP partnership involves accrediting the SBCAF as one of DEC's NGO partners. The DEC will designate schools within Metro Manila and neighbouring provinces where SBCAF can establish a *Living Museum of Native Trees*. It is our dream to have an administrative order issued by the Office of the President declaring July 11 of every year as the *National Native Tree Planting Day*. It will be recalled that July 11 is Saint Benedict's Day in SBC.

REV. FR. PAUL DE VERA, OSB : Celebrating 50 Golden Years of Benedictine Life

The Benedictine Community

At San Beda College Mendiola, Fr. Paul held very important key positions, namely; board trustee (1973-2009); director of services (1965-1998); coordinator of libraries (1967-1998); and sports director (1978-1998), among others.

Also at the Abbey of Our Lady of Montserrat, Fr. Paul held the post of prior administrator (1998-2000); abbey dean (1972-74) and supervisor (delegate) (2000-2003).

At the SBC Alabang, he was also director of services (2000-2003); chaplain (2003-2006). Being coordinator of libraries is a position close to his heart, and which to date Fr. Paul is effectively discharging in the three schools in

San Beda College has been in the service of the Filipino people for 110 years now. So much of what the College is today – relevant academic programs, huge student population, blend of old and modern physical infrastructures, its distinct Bedan spirit and distinguished alumni-ae, all these it owes to the inspired leadership of the Benedictines under whose aegis the College pursues its educational mission.

The young Fr. Paul spent his elementary and high school education in Pangasinan, and later went to San Beda College for a degree in Philosophy and English, and theological studies. At the University of Sto. Tomas, Fr. Paul took BS in Education, and later, Master of Arts in Library Science.

This year, the entire Bedan Community pays tribute to a Benedictine monk and one of San Beda College's great treasures – **REV. FR. PAUL MA. DE VERA, OSB**, on the occasion of his 50th year as a Benedictine priest.

Born in Mangaldan, Pangasinan on September 19, 1938, to **Conrado Centeno de Vera (+)** and **Juana Moyano (+)**, Fr. Paul was ordained priest in June 29, 1961.

Fr. Paul amid his hectic administrative works found time to teach Theology at the College of Arts & Sciences and College of Law from 1975-1990. He occupied various leadership positions in the many professional library organizations and sports leagues to include the NCAA where he represented SBC. Fr. Paul was also recipient of a number of prestigious awards in the field of library science.

In honoring this outstanding Filipino Benedictine educator, the entire Bedan Community wishes him well on his golden jubilee, and pays tribute to his many years of dedicated service to Bedan education. And perhaps, it is Fr. Paul's bountiful reserves of hope, courage, faith, and enduring generosity of his selfless giving that his Bedan family celebrates this year with their highest praise and appreciation for this distinguished man of the Church.

Serving through Priesthood to Holiness

(Homily of Rt. Rev. Tarcisio Ma. H. Narciso, OSB during the Thanksgiving Mass to celebrate the Golden Jubilee of Priesthood of Rev. Fr. Paul De Vera, last May 28, 2011 at the St. Benedict Chapel, San Beda College Alabang)

We are all familiar with the author **Morris West**, who wrote the novel *"The Shoes of the Fisherman"* (which also became a movie) in 1963, wherein he describes the election and career of a Slavic Pope, not knowing that 15 years later the Church will have as **Pope Karol Wojtyla** now **Blessed Pope John Paul II**.

Sometime after his 70th birthday, Morris West wrote an autobiography which he entitled, *"A View from the Ridge"*, a story of his spiritual journey. By ridge here, he meant the angle that 70 years of living had given him. "And what he offers is an exceptionally mature perspective on life. "When you get to be 70 years old, West says, your vocabulary should be pretty simple. You only need to have two words left: *"Thank you!"* He says that gratitude is the real mark of genuine maturity, of spiritual health. And it requires deep spirituality to recognize that everything we are, and everything we have, is a gift from God. And so it is just proper to say *"thank you"* and be filled with graciousness and thankfulness not just when we celebrate our 70th birthday but everyday of lives.

A golden jubilee is a very special occasion. It is a time for thankfulness and gratitude. It is a time to live more closely in relationship with God. In the Bible, the word jubilee meant the ram's horn which was blown to announce the beginning of the fiftieth year calling for the renewal of covenant, a call to live more closely in a special relationship with God. It was in Greek a *"yobalaios"* or *"yubilum"* which means joyous shouting and festivity.

The Book of Leviticus describes what was entailed in the Jubilee Year of the Lord. The land will have a complete rest, all land were to be returned to its rightful owner. Most of all debts were to be forgiven, all slaves were to be freed, and all arguments settled. Do not deal unfairly with your neighbor or exploit him. It must be a celebration in holiness. Injuries and grudges should be forgiven and forgotten. There should be no hatred or injustice in our lives. It must be a time for renewal, a chance to forgive and forget and to start all over again. "It shall be a jubilee for you. The Jubilee shall be a holy and sacred thing for you. For jubilee means being renewed, open to a new life, and to a new beginning – to a newness and freshness in our lives.

As we can see, the celebration of jubilee



according to Leviticus must be both in festivity and in holiness. There is to be a celebration. But there must be also a return to holiness.

In our celebration of the golden jubilee of Fr. Paul as a priest, we cannot forget what **St. John Vianney**, patron of all priests says: the priest continues the work of redemption. "What use would be a house filled with gold, were there no one to open its door? The priest holds the key to the treasures of heaven: it is he who opens the door: he is the steward of the good Lord; the administrator of his goods ... And if he ever realizes what he is, he would die... because God obeys him. He utters a few words and the Lord descends from heaven at his voice, to be contained within a small host.... After God, the priest is everything! ... Only in heaven will he fully realize what he really is. But what is most important is that the priest must have the heart and love of Christ." And I would like to add - But not only the priest, we all must possess the heart and love of Christ.

In the beginning I mentioned Morris West and the need for gratitude. But don't ever be fooled about



this because even for Morris West himself, gratitude wasn't easy to come by. His life, as his autobiography makes clear, had its share of hurts and rejections. So his story also highlights that gratitude is predicated on forgiveness, on letting go of hurts, on not letting the past bitterly color the present. To be grateful is to be forgiving." For we all have hurts, deep hurts. Nobody comes to adulthood without being deeply hurt. None of us is spared life's unfairness. At some point we may feel that we are never quite loved enough, recognized enough, respected enough, or honored enough. Small wonder that it is easier to be bitter than grateful, paranoid than hospitable, angry than gracious."

The Gospel today speaks about God's love for us. He will remain in us, dwell in us, not leave us orphans and send us the Advocate, the Spirit of truth to be our companion in this life's journey. The Lord is inviting us to deeper virtue. He wants us to do what is higher, more sublime, more noble, a love that truly gives up one's life. The Lord wants us to be heroic.

Never giving back in kind. Not giving back bitterness for bitterness, harsh words for harsh words, curse for curse, hatred for hatred. Rising above our sense of being wronged. Renouncing our need to be always right. Moving beyond the itch to always have what is due us. Forgiving, even when every feeling inside of us rebels at its unfairness. Most of all, always offering graciousness, blessing, love, understanding, and forgiveness in spite of everything.

A jubilee celebration is not simply a recalling of memories of days long ago nor listing down past achievements and successes and even failures, but a time for renewing relationships in covenant with the Lord and with one another.

Let us sound the trumpet for the ram's horn summons us back to our original inspiration to be of service to the Lord and His people. Let us make jubilee in the Lord so that we will feel secure and unafraid as we face the future and continue to serve the Lord in joy, hope and security. Let us rejoice in festivity and holiness because the Risen Christ himself renews His covenant of his continuing presence in our midst.

Finally, my dear brothers and sisters, let us continue to pray for Fr. Paul that this celebration will serve to inspire him in his continuing efforts to be holy, to be in close intimacy with the Lord Jesus and in his intimacy with Christ bring all he serves through his priesthood to holiness also. Amen! God bless us all!

A Man of Prayer and Work

Fr. Paul Moyano de Vera, OSB comes from Mangaldan, a town in Pangasinan. In 1954, he graduated from Santo Tomas Catholic School in Mangaldan. In the same year, he entered the Abbey of Our Lady of Montserrat, Mendiola, Manila.

He studied Philosophy both in the Abbey and in San Beda College; and, pursued his theological studies at the Abbey's School of Theology right after his simple profession. On June 29, 1957, he pronounced his solemn vows at the Abbey Church. Four years hence, he was ordained to the priestly ministry. It was on March 21, 1961 at the Manila Cathedral in Intramuros where his **Eminence Rufino Cardinal Santos** ordained the "man of prayer and work", known today as **Father Paul**. He also finished a course in Library Science in 1965 at the University of Santo Tomas.

Father Paul is well-respected and loved by his staff in all San Beda College libraries in Mendiola, Alabang and Rizal campuses. His colleagues in the library profession look up to him as the "unofficial spiritual father and consultant on library matters". He is often invited as a resource person in various seminars and finds time to say Mass in big and important library celebrations.

Fr. Paul possesses the special ability to organize and motivate librarians to pursue bigger goals. So far, he has encouraged professional and paraprofessional librarians to form **MUNPARLAS** (*Muntinlupa, Parañaque, Las Piñas*) Library Association in year 2004 and the Rizal Librarians Association for the province of Rizal in year 2008. Much earlier, he co-founded the Philippine Academic and Research Librarians (**PAARL**) and was its first secretary in 1973. His latest "baby" is the Anolid Barangay Reading Center in Mangaldan, Pangasinan which was inaugurated last June 11, 2010.

Fr. Paul is a selfless person and believes that knowledge must be

shared. He shared his talents and expertise as an officer of the various library and instructional media center organizations. He is a bona fide accreditor of the Philippine Accrediting Association of Schools, Colleges and Universities in the area of library; very much involved with the Mendiola Consortium; taught Library Science subjects at Centro Escolar University from 1974 to 1997; and, currently a member of the board of directors of the National Libraries and Information Services, a sub-committee of the National Commission of Culture and the Arts.

A professional licensed librarian, Fr. Paul is well recognized and has been given awards by various groups and organizations. The latest recognition includes PAARL'S Lifetime Achievement Award last January 28, 2011; PLAIS Special



Award given last November 30, 2010; Outstanding Librarian Award (2010) from the Southern Tagalog Region Librarians Council; and Outstanding Librarian Award by the UST Library Science Alumni Association last April 2, 2011 on the occasion of UST's 400 years anniversary.

Writing is also one of Fr. Paul's hidden talents. He was then the author of the bulletin of the Seventh CONSAL (Congress of Southeast Asian Librarians) 1987; editor of the



IFLA Newsletter during the 46th International Federation of the Library Associations Conference held in Manila on August 18-23.

Father Paul's other love is sports. He is very much a part of National Collegiate Athletic Association (**NCAA**) as San Beda College's representative to the Management Committee. On March 19, 2010, NCAA South which he helped founded 12 years ago awarded him a plaque of recognition in appreciation of his unwavering support and unselfish commitment towards sports development especially in the countryside. He is one of the pioneers and current member of the board of directors of Samahang Basketbolista ng Pilipinas.

But over and above all these external activities, Father Paul remains humble and faithful to being a monk and religious priest. He is still serving the Benedictine Community in various capacities as member of the board of trustees, San Beda College Alabang; formerly prior administrator; and presently, the prefect of the junior clerics.

We join Father Paul as he celebrates the greatest and most important milestone of his life, fifty (50) long, fruitful years and unblemished service as a priest. We salute him and continue to pray that the loving God and Father shower him His endless love, peace and joy.

I chanced upon an interesting TV program the other day. It showed recording team who went around a very busy street corner, stopping people, pointing the camera at their faces and telling them: "You've got two minutes on the air to say anything you want for the whole country to hear."

No one had a prepared text. All 30 guests talked off the top of their heads. This went on for an hour and every person, without exception, talked of only one thing – complaint. Each one complained about home, family, high taxes, the high cost of living, about school or study or jobs, deteriorating peace and order, corruption and so on.

All of these people seemed to have thought to themselves, "This is my big chance: the whole country will be watching. I'll tell them how bad things really are. Then everyone will know what's wrong with the world."

Not one thought of mentioning what's right with the world...or what is right with their lives. Not one of the 30 thought of smiling into the camera and saying he or she was happy.....enjoying good health, blessed with a caring and loving family and so on.

COMMENCEMENT ADDRESS OF
DR. MANUEL V. PANGILINAN – CLASS 2011

Reverend Father Abbott, Father Rector, Dean Juanillo, distinguished members of the faculty and administration, fellow Bedans, Members of the Graduating Class of 2011: Magandang hapon sa inyong lahat.

It is a genuine pleasure to be with you today. It feels good to be back to the place which launched my own journey in life – a journey of preparation and discovery.

I'm also delighted by how well both our senior and junior basketball teams did in last year's NCAA. We must be champions again in 2011!

But I must admit that whenever I step through the main gate into this Plaza Montserrat, I stop being your chairman of the board, and revert to the young man who grew up within these walls. So today, as I look upon your young faces, I cannot help but look back to my own time in San Beda, and reflect on what it did to help me with my life.

Introduction

A few weeks ago, I sat down with some of you—San Beda's best and brightest—for an informal exchange of ideas. I was greatly impressed by the quality of their questions. I'd like to share with you my response to, and my experience, with them.

I was asked: What did San Beda do for me? What distinguishes Bedan Education from that of other schools? What are the secrets to success?

My own beginnings

As some of you may know, I was not born into a life of privilege or pedigree. My *Lolo* started as a public school teacher in Pampanga rising through the ranks to become superintendent of public schools and, eventually, secretary of education. But he did not finish college. My father began his career as a messenger at Philippine National Bank, and retired as president of Traders Royal Bank, one of the larger banks in the 80's.

During my elementary and high school years in Mendiola, I had ten centavos to buy a bottle of coke, five centavos for crackers, another ten centavos to take the bus home from Legarda to Little Baguio in San Juan – which I made sure I wouldn't lose, otherwise I would have to walk home. On late Friday afternoons after the mandatory military training, buses and jeepneys along Legarda would be full. So I had to walk all the way to Quiapo to get a ride to San Juan.

Marami sa mga kaklase ko noon nakakotse, at yung iba may driver pa. Ang swerte nila, sabi ko. Balang araw, magiging ganun din ako.

In 1970, I started my career as executive assistant with a salary of 1,000 pesos a month. In 1976, I moved to Hong Kong as an overseas Filipino worker to work for American Express Bank. Five years later, in 1981 – 30 years ago to be precise—I founded First Pacific Company in Hong Kong. Now First Pacific has businesses in Southeast Asia, employs more than 100,000 people, and owns some of the biggest companies in the region—like Indofood in Indonesia and PLDT in the Philippines.

As you can see, for three generations of my family, life meant coping with challenges despite modest means, relying on God-given talent, hard work and a passionate determination to succeed. For my family, San Beda's motto – *ora et labora*—has not only been a way of life, but the best way to realize our dreams.

The enduring qualities of my education in San Beda find expression in the values I continue to cherish and practice to this day – discipline, a passion for excellence, and the belief that work is indeed God's prayer. These are the same four principles that vitalize *Regula Sancti Benedicti* – The Rule of Saint Benedict – the oldest living organizational document in the world.

Secrets to success

I was also asked—what the secrets to success are?



My response was quite simple –when it comes to success, there are no secrets, no mysteries, no magic. And no shortcuts.

I said that success springs from old-fashioned values – values that are permanent and enduring, values that transcend the context and circumstance of our time. These values are as basic as being honest – and truthful – with your fellowmen, and with yourself, especially. Values that are as fundamental as working hard, playing fair, and doing no harm to others.

At First Pacific, we believe in old-fashioned values, and in the ethical behavior by which we practice them. We know that the growth of our companies can only be sustained by treating our many stakeholders– our customers, shareholders, employees – justly and well.

We've created a corporate culture that promotes an open and honest style. We encourage people to speak up – freely and without fear. By being transparent, we may be more open to criticisms – but transparency cultivates honesty and, ironically, a stronger sense of security. Openness breeds fresh ideas and enables our organization to renew its vigor when needed. The ability to relate and communicate is important to us. We don't like surprises.

That's why management – especially the chief executive officer – must not only be exemplary stewards of corporate assets. But they also must serve as the moral compass for the organization. That is precisely the challenge of leadership in our time – and in our country – to shape a culture where honesty is paramount, where integrity starts from the top, and where success is built from the ground up.

The Bedan Education

Finally, I was asked: Was your San Beda education useful?

In my time, San Beda placed a huge emphasis on discipline and rigor in thought and in deed. Academic excellence was stressed as much as our spiritual life.

The San Beda of yesteryears is similar to what it is today—giving a warm, family feeling, a sense of prideful belonging to a special brotherhood. Perhaps San Beda's relative smallness, has enabled us to feel we're one community.

I learned how to set high goals, and high ambitions. Even today, I tell myself and my associates, if our goals are not high enough, why bother? Mediocrity is easy—most everyone can achieve it. Excellence is difficult—not everyone can attain it. So I say to you – go for excellence – it belongs to a space less crowded.

My competitive spirit may have been nurtured by contests we had here in San Beda. These were Spelling, Mathematics, and Religion. I remember winning a spelling contest by only one point – with the word —*precocious*, which I didn't even understand at that time. Wanting to win these contests drove me to study hard. In spelling for example, to practice, I would ask my sister to read out random words from the dictionary for me to spell. But it wasn't just words which I was learning – it was a winning attitude, a positive frame of mind, a passion for excellence, that were the critical lessons.

Of course, ambition is one thing, and execution, another. I learned not just to dream, but to work towards that dream – inch by inch, stone by stone, step by step.

Setting high goals means taking big risks and, inevitably in some cases, making mistakes. This is another lesson I'd like to share with you: Don't be afraid to make mistakes, because you're still young and can afford it, and because you're likely to learn more from them than you will from your successes. Today people see First Pacific as a hugely successful business. But they also forget that we made many mistakes along the way. The difference is that I wasted little time on feeling bad and sorry for myself after a failure. The best antidote to failure is action – because the world out there is nothing if not a world of endless action, of choices made daily, of decisions taken constantly.

Conclusion

Let me now close by leaving you with these thoughts.

To the graduates, I say this—with your San Beda Education, you're being given something in trust – to care for, to use in a beneficial way, and to give back to your school in as good or better condition than when you first entered these walls. The entrustment bestowed upon you is knowledge – a knowledge that will deepen to understanding and wisdom over time.

Much have passed since San Beda was founded 110 years ago. But the importance of this day we should appreciate: **San Beda's grand tradition of education and its simple purpose of a better future.** This purpose will be achieved in our duty, and our duty fulfilled in service to one another.

As you take leave of this school, as you say goodbye to your friends and faculty, may I remind you that you will remain part of San Beda long after you've left. If you stay true to the best of your education here in San Beda, you will stay true to yourself. Finally, you belong to one of the country's best colleges. You are fortunate because the future lies wide open for you. Granted, you're entering a pretty screwed up world. Many in my own generation dared to dream, and fight, and risk, in order to succeed.

You should do no less. So just do it!

I am honoured to have joined the fellowship of Class 2011, and to have walked with you as you start your journey towards a new life.

God bless you all. And God bless San Beda.

SEODEL HEARTY T. PILAPIL 3rd Placer, May 2011 CPA Board Exams **The OFW's son rises**

In this decade-old phenomenon of Filipino parents leaving their young brood behind in order to try their luck abroad, it is so inspiring to see young men who are able to create their own lives, survive their parents' absence and end up reaching for their dreams.

Such is the poignant story of San Beda's latest pride **Seodel Hearty T. Pilapil**, third placer in the May 2011 CPA licensure examinations. At a very young age, Seodel's mother had to work in Hong Kong as a domestic helper for 20 years, and his father who could not find a job in the country, tried his luck in Australia as an auto mechanic. Seodel in his young mind then could hardly

understand their impoverished condition and why both his parents had to leave them for an extended and indefinite periods in order to provide for the growing needs of the family.

Forced to confront the paradox of the absentee-parent-providers, Seodel in his young heart, immensely missed the loving and living presence of his **nanay** and **tatay** who nonetheless dutifully sent over to the family their dollar remittances. It was a hard life for Seodel and family members who in fairness attempted to bridge the physical distance that overseas migration have brought them in.

Amid the difficult family life circumstances and a deep sense of loss, Seodel made a commitment to endure and rise above his situation. And as fate brought him to San Beda, Seodel promised to do well in his studies. But it was again a rough sailing life in SBC, being in the challenging accountancy course.

Much to his disappointment, Seodel was not able to graduate on time due to a failing grade. But the Filipino resilient trait in him made Seodel to dream big, no matter what. He went to the CPA review school with his "*big dream*" to become a CPA board topnotcher. And so he did, with a high **91.86%** rating thus, entitling him to garner the third highest place in the government licensure examinations for CPAs.

In the recently held testimonial dinner for new Bedan CPAs, Seodel Pilapil recounted his poignant and inspiring tale of how adversities forced him to be strong, gave important life lessons and brought him opportunities to emerge eventually a *Big Winner*.

This kind of story has become typical nowadays among Filipino families. Nevertheless, Seodel's story has to be told and retold for it inspires and instills in others a sense of hope for the future, especially to families torn apart by overseas migration. And this is **Seodel Hearty Pilapil's** tale on how he, an OFW's son, has risen.

(March 20, 1920 – May 18, 2011)

The last time **Mr. Eugenio Reyes** (*HS '37*) dropped by his beloved alma mater was in December 10, 2010 when a classroom in Saint Bede's building bearing his name was blessed, and a commemorative marker with his portrait was unveiled. In spite of problems in his mobility, Gene, as he was fondly called by peers, was very happy then, knowing that a classroom in his well-loved school would carry his name in perpetuity. The San Beda Graduate School of Business and the San Beda College of Arts & Sciences – Accountancy Department named the classroom **THE EUGENIO R. REYES ROOM** in recognition of his outstanding achievements in the field of the accountancy profession marked by loyalty, diligence, dedication and competence; his being an inspiring example of professionalism; and his having contributed much to building the College as a Christian community and Benedictine family; and his having epitomized and exemplified the Benedictine ideals of *pax, ora et labora*, and the Bedan values of *fides, scientia et virtus*.

A recognized pillar in the accountancy profession, **Mr. Eugenio Reyes** worked arduously to reach the top. A proud son of Bulacan who graduated honourable mention in high school from San Beda College in 1937, Mr. Reyes was fourth place in the CPA licensure examinations. In

1940, he distinguished himself in public and private accounting becoming partner at SyCip, Gorres, Velayo & Company for 33 years, 22 of which as Senior Partner, and 11 years as member of the SGV Management Committee. He retired from the firm in 1980. In his early years, Mr. Reyes worked as supervisor, and worked his way to partnership at Fleming & Williamson, CPAs for eight years. Retirement spelled the beginning of an active career in private accounting. Mr. Reyes served as chairman of five companies and held the same position at the Credit Information Bureau Inc. for 10 years. He served as director in a bank, a holding company, foreign airlines, publicly listed companies, a communication company, and a manufacturing company. Mr. Reyes was chairman and member of the Board of Accountancy for 11 years. While in government, he was director of two government corporations and was member of a Presidential Fact-Finding Committee. During his lifetime, the accounting profession was close to the heart of Mr. Reyes. He served as president of the PICPA for two years; president of the ASEAN Federation of Accountants; PICPA director for eight years; vice chairman of the PICPA Foundation; and technical adviser of the Council of the International Federation of Accountants in the USA.

Reyes celebrated his 91st birthday with a simple get-together in his Quezon City house. Among the guests were members of the Benedictine Community composed of Rt. Rev. Fr. Tarcisio Ma. H. Narciso, OSB; Fr. Benigno Benabarre, OSB; Fr. Basil Apostol, OSB; and Prof. Joffre Alajar.

His son **Roman Felipe "Manny" Reyes** (*GS '64, HS '68, BSC Accounting & Auditing '72*) told **Father Tarcisio** that even in his sick bed, his father was humming the popular "*Red and White*" cheering song. Manny requested for a tape of this well-known Bedan hymn from the alumni office, and this was played every now and then while recuperating from his illness. During his 91st birthday party, this was the song most requested by him. The old man, considered one of the few oldest surviving Bedans, was at his best elements when he heard this song, as he reminisced his good old happy days in San Beda College.

Indeed, **Mr. Eugenio Reyes** remained a loyal Bedan until the very end. He lived a full life and is probably singing now the Red and White song with more gusto, this time with fellow Bedans in heaven. Further, Mr. Reyes must be yelling at us now with a hearty laugh, "*Bedans, Go San Beda Fight!*"

Enhorabuena, Fr. Benabarre@ 96!

Last, May 23, 2011, Monday, our beloved **Rev. Fr. Benigno Benabarre, OSB** turned 96 (wowowee!). And in the SBC Alumni Office, we thought that it was our role to be leading the Bedan Community into thanksgiving and celebration of another significant milestone in the life of this revered Benedictine priest.

Modernity has indeed long disturbed even our Benedictine religious order, that today, we crave for true role models of humility, compassion, obedience and a lot more holy virtues which its founder, Saint Benedict of Nursia, expected from no less than his followers.

And so it pleases us to no end, to still find some religious like Fr. Benabarre who live up to our "ideal" Benedictine father.

Sad to say, his likes have become a rarity now-a-days. And so we can only thank God for blessing Fr. Benabarre with a long productive life, so that we still have his inspiring presence in today's world wanting of role models like him.

Today, generations of Bedans connect, as we all remember how this well-admired monk has touched lives of both old and young.

In 1994, when he came back to San Beda College after almost three decades of stay in Spain, USA and Puerto Rico, Fr. B, as some of us endearingly call him, opted to reincorporate himself for good to the Abbey of Our Lady of Montserrat and work as assistant moderator in the alumni office.

His presence in the alumni office allowed SBC to reconnect to its past, and provided a much-needed reminder of those eras of innocence and great achievements, even as San Beda continues to reinvent itself today to enable it to face the insurmountable challenges of twenty-first century education.

At 96, Fr. B is still physically and mentally strong, with a perfect blood chemistry which he proudly shares with us every now and then. Except for his tired and shaking knees, Fr. B. remains healthy, reporting everyday in the office and observing the usual eight to five working hours. He uses the computer, maintains an e-mail account and avails of the vast services of information technology in this day and age of digitalization. At 96, Fr. B amazingly writes a lot- for *The Bedan Alumnus*, the SBCAA official news magazine which he founded in 1962; for a Spanish newspaper (*El Visitante de Puerto Rico*); a weekly article and, has published almost 40 books and pamphlets.

Fr. Abbot Tarcisio Narciso, OSB would constantly thank Fr. Benigno for setting a good example as a monk, still regularly joining the Community at the Divine office and the Holy Eucharist.

Even at his advance age, Fr. B. continues to find new meaning in his vocation. Late last year, he found himself engaged with the "Little Sisters of the Abandoned Elderly", a congregation whose mission is to take care of old people, aged 60 years and above who have been abandoned by



their respective families and are financially challenged. Fr. B is helping to raise substantial funds to keep the institution going. This June, 2011, he plans to visit Spain to research on the lives of the Spanish Benedictines who served before as abbots of San Beda College. It will also be the best time for him to pay a visit to his equally aging sister who is turning 100 years old, and younger brother who at 87 is also amazingly strong. Fr. B proudly tells us that his family lineage has been blessed with long healthy lives, so it does not come to a surprise that he himself has been blessed with good genes that make one live longer.

And how does he see himself on his 96th birthday? Fr. B. speaks from the heart - "to give more of myself, serve more, and be forever grateful to God for His unending grace."

What else can we say to those 96 well-lived years and counting more, than — enhorabuena, Fr. Benabarre! Undoubtedly, you are our true Benedictine role model.



NO EASY TITLE DEFENSE FOR ALL-FILIPINO LIONS

The NCAA Season 87's basketball hostilities started last July 2 with defending seniors champions San Beda Red Lions crashing host Perpetual Help Altas, 82-52, in a prolific display of firepower and stonewall defense, to begin their title defense on a high note.

However, this year will certainly be a lot different from SBC's conquest of the 2010 Season, where the Bedan ballers swept all their opponents for an immaculate 18-0 record, for they will have to defend their crown without American recruit **Su Daniels**. The 6'7" center from Los Angeles busted his knee during training just two weeks before the tournament opened.

Daniels was not just a vital cog in last year's unblemished season for SBC. He was in fact named Season 86's MVP and Best Defensive Player. He averaged over 11 points, 11 rebounds and 4 blocks per game. These are huge numbers for SBC, especially on the defensive end. He sustained an ACL injury that will need at least four months to heal. This means that Su will not be able to play in the NCAA any longer. He will be over the age limit by next year.

And so, the Red Lions will have to go to battle with an all-Filipino roster for the first time since capturing the NCAA championship in 2006. Since then, they amassed four titles, three of which were won with Nigerian behemoth **Sam Ekwe** (2006, 2007, and 2008), and one with Daniels (2010). SBC lost the title series to San Sebastian in 2009. Another Nigerian recruit, **Ola Adeogun**, is still serving

his 2-year residency and will suit up for the Lions next year. But for now, it's up to the local boys to retain the crown.

But the Red and White squad remains formidable this year and is still expected to emerge on top, even as the league increased its membership to 10 schools with the entry of the Lyceum of the Philippines. Back to see action for the Lions are ace gunner and skipper **Garvo Lanete**, former NCAA Juniors All-Stars MVP **Dave Marcelo**, former NCAA Juniors MVP **Jake Pascual**, hotshot **Rome Dela Rosa**, the bull-strong Australian twins **David** and **Anthony Semerad**, spitfire **Anjo Caram**, the towering **Kyle Pascual**, shifty guard **Mar Villahermosa**, and the vastly improved duo of **Melo Lim** and **Mike Sorela**.

The prized rookie for SBC this season is no less than last year's NCAA Juniors MVP **Baser Amer**, who steered the Red Cubs to back-to-back titles. Although he has big shoes to fill with the graduation of 2010 team captain **Borgie Hermida**, Amer boasts of outstanding numbers from his high school stints, averaging double digits in points, assists and rebounds. He was also a former member of the National Youth Team. The other neophytes are guards **Ryusei Koga**, a transferee from San Beda Alabang, and **Paolo Pontejos**.

With this line-up, the Red Lions enjoy the deepest bench once again, with a good mixture of battle-tested veterans and a heavily skilled second unit.

But Coach **Frankie Lim** can expect a stiffer competition this year with virtually all teams shoring up their rosters. The biggest threats this season are expected to come from the SSC Stags and Mapua Cardinals. Despite losing head coach **Ato Agustin** to the pros, San Sebastian still has key players **Calvin Abueva**, **Ronald Pascual** and **Ian Sanggalang** to carry the cudgels for new coach **Topex Robinson**. MIT, on the other hand, got a gem of a rookie in 6'7" Fil-Palestinian **Yusef Taha** to join forces with the sweet-shooting **Allan Mangahas**, **Mark Sarangay** and ex-Red Cub **Rodel Ranises**.

Also dangerous are the hard-fighting Letran Knights, with prolific scorer **Kevin Alas**, the energetic **Jose Rizal Heavy Bombers**, sans their Cameroonian imports **Joe Etame** and **John Njei**, and the much improved and intact Arellano Chiefs, which listed two African imports to back-up topscorer **Adrian Celada**.

Other teams are the St. Benilde Blazers, **Emillo Aguinaldo** Generals, Perpetual Help Altas and Lyceum Pirates.

It surely won't be a walk in the park for the Red Lions like last year but they are certainly ready for the challenge. The squad will miss Su's intimidating presence inside the paint, but **Dave** and **Jake** are prepared to assume that job. And so are the rest of the Lions. Indeed, capturing this year's crown will be sweeter with an all-Pinoy crew. And the Red Lions have the chance to silence their critics once and for all.

'77, made it to the six-person JBC short list for the vacancies created when **Supreme Court Justices Eddie Nachura, LL.B., '67, and Chit Carpio Morales (UP)** retired. I pushed in particular for Rudy as he has two years to go. He knocked down the unconstitutional JBC-made rule that if one was from outside (non-career), 65 was the limit.
