With these first lines from the San Beda College Hymn, Bedans once again take a bow as the San Beda College Alumni Association (SBCAA) pays tribute to them in the annual Red and White Ball.

In its 117 years of existence, San Beda College has produced countless graduates who have been living interesting and inspiring lives. Thus, the SBCAA considers it an inherent responsibility to mirror and honor these quintessential Bedans for their laudable achievements so that the youth can follow their footsteps. Proudly, San Beda College is the only school which has a Red and White Ball to celebrate its alumni's achievements.

It was in the 1950s when the Red and White Ball was conceived to celebrate championships in the NCAA basketball games when the Red Lion was then the team to beat. From thereon, a victory ball dubbed "Red and White Ball" would be anticipated not only by the members of the Bedan Community but the *alta sociedad* of Manila as well.

Tonight, the SBCAA once again drops the curtains of its time-honored Red and White Ball as an ode not only to the College's winning in various sports competitions, but also to numerous Bedan achievements for AY 2016-2017. For decades now since the SBCAA came into existence, the annual Bedan event being looked forward to, other than the Homecoming, is the Red and White Ball. A *"Celebration of Bedan Pride and Glory"* has always been the heart and soul of this special gathering of Bedans, families and friends.

#### **A Bedan event like no other**

A toast to Bedan brotherhood, the annual Grand Alumni Homecoming would by tradition, be preceded by this victory ball, in the 1960s and onwards. The most colourful Red and White Ball celebrations prior to its revival in 1998, included the one held at the Wack Wack Golf and Country Club in 1965, at the Manila Hilton in 1971 and when the school became champion in both Junior and senior basketball games in the NCAA in 1977. Since its conception in the 1950s, the Red and White Ball refused to be a mere social event for the elite but a socially relevant event with a laudable cause. Through the years, it was able to raise substantial funds for various SBCAA commendable project undertakings.

As even good things never last, the Red and White Ball faded into oblivion in the decade of the '80s until towards the later part of the '90s when the preparations for this big Bedan event became too costly and burdensome to both the school and the SBCAA. It was however replaced by other notable but easy-to-organize social functions.

But truly, Bedan gatherings would never be the same again without a Red and White Ball. In December 1997, a group of officers of the SBC Alumni Association brainstormed on the possibility of reviving the Red and White Ball to build up momentum for the centennial of San Beda College in 2001. Having felt the enthusiasm of everyone to revive this important Bedan celebration, the SBCAA Board of Directors approved the rebirth of the Red and White Ball in 1998, two days prior to the February grand alumni





homecoming. Through the hard work, persistence and inspiration of Dr. Jaime Galvez Tan, Mr. Tomas P. Africa, Mr. Jose Mari V. Lacson and Mr. Ben Farralles, the Red and White Ball once again became a high profile social event given prominence in the pages of leading local papers. The Red and White Affair successfully brought together the alumni of several decades and renewed their bond with their alma mater and fellow Bedans. To date, the 1998 Red and White Ball held at the stately Manila Hotel was the most "star-studded", gathering prominent Bedan personalities and friends. The affair also brought in sizeable funds to help finance scholarships, sports development, professional chairs research and physical plant improvements—all aimed to bring San Beda College to even greater heights.



#### **The Red & White Ball and the Homecoming: Twin Wins**

Since its revival in 1998, the annual Red and White Ball has metamorphosed into a great Bedan tradition worth holding alive through the succeeding years. It has indeed brought back many Bedans to their second home, issuing a bold statement of Bedan fellowship and camaraderie. The impressive attendance of Bedans and friends in the Ball since its revival in 1998 is a concrete proof that this affair is here to stay and will be an integral part of the annual Bedan homecomings.

At the dawn of a new century, the Red and White Ball has emerged as a truly





big event, celebrating much of Bedan achievement. Thanks to the officers and members of the San Beda College Alumni Association, most especially outstanding Bedan Manuel V. Pangillinan, who has been consistently giving his full support to the Red and White Ball since 2000.



A tribute to Bedan exemplars, and more. Tonight, on the occasion of the 92nd founding anniversary of the San Beda College Alumni Association, the Red and White Ball unfolds another grand celebration of Bedan Excellence—the Diamond, Ruby, Golden (Class '67) and Silver (Class '92) Jubilarians who by tradition hosted the year's homecoming. ## President Rodrigo R. Duterte

(Law '72)

The footprints of excellence in the life of San Beda are made remarkably visible by distinguished Bedans who continue to be successful builders of what the Philippine has become today.

Once such Bedan who shares one clear and defining characteristic with other great Bedans is President Rodrigo Roa Duterte.

### First Bedan President

This long drought for a Bedan President has ended last June 30, 2016 when Rodrigo Roa Duterte was proclaimed as the 16th President of the Republic of the Philippines, making him the first-ever Bedan to become President.

He is also known by the nickname **Digong**. A Filipino lawyer and politician of Visayan descent, Rody is the first Mindanaoan president of the country.

Considered as one of the longest-serving mayors in the Philippines, he was Mayor of Davao City, a highly urbanized city on Mindanao Island, for seven terms, totalling more than 22 years. He has also served as vice-mayor and as



congressman for the city.

Nicknamed "The Punisher", a vigilante group called the Davao Death Squad has been tied to President Duterte by human rights organizations and are responsible for the extrajudicial killings of petty criminals and drug dealers. Over a period of 20 years, he turned Davao City from the "murder capital of the Philippines" to what tourism organizations now describe as "the most peaceful city in southeast Asia," and what numbeo.com ranks as the world's fourth safest place.

President Duterte was urged to run for the Philippine presidency numerous times, but he refused these offers until well into 2015 on the grounds of a "flawed government system", old age and opposition from his family. Nevertheless, on November 21, 2015, he declared his candidacy in the 2016 election contest for the office of the President of the Philippines, and won with a landslide victory, garnering 16,601,997 votes. Duterte took office on June 30, 2016, for a term of six years.

### **President Duterte's Childhood Years**

President Duterte was born on March 28, 1945, in Maasin (now the capital of Southern Leyte but was then part of the Insular province of Leyte in the Philippine Commonwealth). His father was Cebuano lawyer Vicente G. Duterte and his mother was Soledad Roa, a native of Cabadbaran, Agusan, who was a school teacher and a civic leader of Maranao descent. Duterte's father Vicente, prior to being provincial governor of (the then-undivided) Davao province, was once an acting mayor of Danao, Cebu. Rodrigo's cousin Ronald, on the other hand, served as Cebu City mayor from 1983 to 1986. Ronald's father, Ramon Duterte, also held the position from 1957 to 1959. The Dutertes consider the Cebu-based political families of the Durano and the Almendras clan as relatives. Duterte also has relatives from the Roa clan in Leyte through his mother's side. Before they resettled to Davao, Duterte's family briefly lived in his birthplace in Maasin, Leyte, and in his father's hometown in Danao, Cebu, until he was four years old.

The Dutertes initially moved to Mindanao in 1948 but still go back and forth to the Visayas until 1949. They finally settled in the Davao Region in 1950. Vicente as a lawyer engaged in private practice, while Soledad taught in public schools as a teacher. Mrs Duterte, however, retired as a supervisor in 1952 when her lawyer-husband entered politics there.

### **President Duterte's Education**

The young Duterte went to Laboon Elementary School in Maasin, for a year. He spent his remaining elementary days at the Santa Ana Elementary School in Davao City, where he graduated in 1956.

He finished his secondary education in then Holy Cross College of Digos (now Cor Jesu College) in today's city of Digos in the now defunct Davao province, after being expelled twice from previous schools, including one in Ateneo de Davao University due to misconduct. At the tertiary level, he graduated in 1968 with a Bachelor of Arts degree in Political Science at the Lyceum of the Philippines in Manila. He also obtained a law degree from San Beda College of Law, still in Manila, in 1972. In the same year, he passed the bar exam. Rody Duterte eventually became Special Counsel at the City Prosecution Office in Davao City from 1977–78; Fourth Assistant City Prosecutor from 1979–81; Third Assistant City Prosecutor from 1981–83; and Second Assistant City Prosecutor from 1983–86.

Rody Duterte claimed publicly to have shot a fellow student while in law school for allegedly bullying him because of his Visayan origins. His victim, however, survived, and although he was prohibited from participating in the commencement march, he did graduate.



## Early Public Service

### Davao City mayor

After the 1986 People Power Revolution, Rody Duterte was appointed officer-in-charge vice mayor. In 1988, he ran for mayor and won, serving until 1998. He set a precedent by designating deputy mayors that represented the Lumad and Moro peoples in the city government, which was later copied in other parts of the Philippines. In 1998, because he was term-limited to run again for mayor, he ran for the House of Representatives and won as Congressman of the 1st District of Davao City. (under the Laban ng Makabayang Masang Pilipino coalition) In 2001, he ran again for mayor in Davao and was again elected for his fourth term. He was re-elected in 2004 and in 2007.

Davao City under Rody Duterte won the National Literacy Hall of Fame Award for being a three-time first-place winner in the Outstanding Local Government Unit, Highly Urbanized City category. In 2013, Davao City sent rescue and medical teams to Tacloban to give aid to the victims of Typhoon Haiyan, locally known in the country as Typhoon Yolanda. Financial assistance was also given to Bohol and Cebu for the earthquake victims.

One article of TIME magazine shows him patrolling in Davao City's streets on one of his big motorcycles, leading a convoy complete with blaring sirens and M16 rifles. Local news reports show him foregoing the pomp, opting to inspect in a regular taxi, surprising his would-be passengers.

Though vocally supportive of the extra-judicial killings of habitual drug users and dealers, President Duterte used city government funds to build a Php12-million drug rehabilitation and treatment center which provides 24-hour services. In 2003, he offered a Php2,000 monthly allowance to drug addicts who personally approached him and committed to kick the habit. President Duterte is also publicly known for visiting remote New People's Army camps negotiating peace transaction efforts and advocating diplomacy.

President Rody Duterte was also the first mayor in the Philippines to give formal representation to the indigenous Lumad and Muslim community, designating deputy mayors to represent their interests in the local government. The anti-discrimination ordinance he mandated, was reportedly a response to news he received that Muslims were being discriminated against by real estate agents.

In 2010, he was elected vice mayor, succeeding his daughter, Sara Duterte-Carpio, who was elected as mayor. He has been offered the Interior Secretary post 4 times, by presidents Fidel V. Ramos, Joseph Ejercito Estrada, Gloria Macapagal-Arroyo, and Benigno S. Aquino III but rejected all of them. In April 2014, he also declined a nomination for the World Mayor Prize, given by an international body to outstanding mayors saying "he was just doing his job." Among the other awards Duterte also refused to accept for Davao City includes the one given by the American Cancer Society and the 2010 anti-smoking award in Singapore.

### Law and Order

Through the support of President Duterte, the City Council amended ordinance No. 1627, Series of 1994, to impose a prohibition on selling, serving, drinking and consuming alcoholic beverages from 01:00 until 08:00 each morning. Executive Order No. 39 was signed by President Duterte, reducing the speed limits for all kinds of motor vehicles within the territorial jurisdiction of Davao City in the interest of public safety and order.

President Duterte also signed Executive Order No. 04, Series of 2013 to



Impose an order creating the Implementing of rules and regulations for the new comprehensive anti-smoking ordinance no. 0367-12, Series of 2012. Davao City's Firecracker Ban was also implemented with ordinance No. 060-02/1406-02, Series of 2002 by the City Council through the support of Duterte.

Another known accomplishment was that the City Government of Davao was able to acquire 10 more ambulances for central 911 intended for medical emergencies and 42 new mobile patrol vehicles and motorcycles for the Davao City Police Office (the first and only 9-1-1 emergency telephone number in Asia which is also free of charge). President Duterte, through Executive Order No. 24, ordered all shopping malls and commercial centers to install, operate and maintain high end and high definition closed circuit television (CCTV) cameras at all entrance and exit points of their premises. President Duterte also passed the city's Women Development Code, the first and only in the country, which aims "to uphold the rights of women and the belief in their worth and dignity as human beings" and pushed for the Magna Carta for Women in Davao. It is a comprehensive women's human rights law that seeks to eliminate discrimination against women. This law recognizes, protects, fulfills, and promotes the rights of Filipino women.

### **The Presidency**

On May 30, 2016, the 16th Congress of the Philippines proclaimed Rodrigo R. Duterte as the President-elect of the Philippines after he topped the official count by the Congress of the Philippines on May 27, 2016, with 16,601,997 votes, 6.6 million more than his closest rival, Mar Roxas.

At the age of 71, President Duterte became the oldest person ever elected to the presidency, after former President Sergio Osmeña. Duterte is also the first local chief executive to get elected straight to the Office of the President and the first Visayan from Mindanao. President Duterte's presidency began following his inauguration on June 30, 2016 at the Rizal Ceremonial Hall of the Malacañang Palace in Manila, which was attended by more than 627 guests. Shortly after his inauguration, President Duterte held his first Cabinet meeting to lay out their first agenda.

Today, President Duterte continues to make a big difference in the lives of the Filipinos.

### **The Recognition**

The Distinguished Bedan Awards is a special



recognition given by the SBCAA to Bedans who have exhibited greatness of the Bedan spirit through their lifetime works, service, and dedication to the Bedan Community, in particular and to the Filipino people, in general.

- Studied in San Beda College for at least two (2) years or holder of a San Beda College Diploma

- Held a reputation of proven competence, integrity, and work ethic; and
- Epitomized and exemplified the Benedictine ideals of *pax, ora et labora*, and the Bedan values of *fides, scientia et virtus*.

*Atek*, as he is fondly called by his peers has been in the music industry for decades now. He has been synonymous with exceptional pop artists and musicians. Mr. Jacinto was a former manager of the popular Circus Band of the 70s. He now operates the Entertainment Arts Center in Manila. Atek at present manages the Circus Band 2. He discovered and trained singers and musicians like Basil Valdez, Haji Alejandro, Tillie Moreno, Jacqui Magno, to name a few. He conceptualized developed and managed the Circus Band in the 70's and the Rage Band in the 80's. In 1971, the Manila Symphony Orchestra chose him to train the combined choruses of the New Dimension Singers and the Madrigal Singers for the epochal rock-opera, *Jesus Christ, Superstar*.

At age 17, he was picked to join the US tour of *Sing Out Asia* as its assistant music director. He composed "Time to Change", a song that was picked up by the religious community and made into a Church song. He was a voice coach TV/movie personalities, among them were: Martin Nievera, Vira Morales, Dingdong Avarizado, Gino Padilla, Franco Laurel, and many others.

As a stage director and music director, his concert production of the *Sing Out Philippines* in 1969 and the *New Dimensions Singers* in 1970 and 1971 at the Cultural Center of the Philippines were singular achievements. He produced the four albums of the Circus ben under the Vicor label. In 2007, he created the prototype Philippine Latin Jazz Orchestra featuring the top 17 Filipino musicians for a videotaped performance at the Entertainment Arts Center in Makati before a select audience of the Spanish Chamber of Commerce Instituto Cervantes De Manila. This orchestra played among others the latin-jazz versions of "Anak" and "Tubig at Langis".

He was President of Entertainment Arts Holdings Corp; Filipino Society of Composers, Authors and Publishers (FILSCAP) (1975-present); Lead convenor of The Band Alliance (1998-present); and Member of Core Committee of Pinoy Classic Rock (2005-present). Atek was finalist composer of "Walk that Mile" for the 1971 Yamaha World Popular Song and "Got to Save the World" for the 1974 Tokyo Music Festival.

The saga of Bedan achievement would not be complete without citing Arch. Ernesto Antonino Nasol, is the principal Architect of EAD Nasol Architects – Interiors Designers, Consultant responsible for local and international conceptual and design development projects. He is the local consultant partner of CPCS a Canadian company that is involved on PPP projects on transportation systems in the Philippines.

As a practicing Architect and for his contribution to the profession, he gained his stature, FELLOW, from the Philippine Institute of Architects (PIA) where he served as the National President in 1990-1991, Chancellor of the PIA College of Fellows in 2000 and 2010 Executive Director of the Annual PIA National Convention 2003 and 2008. He was the 12th recipient of the highest recognition for service award.

In 2010, he was elevated to the roster of regional Asia Pacific Economic Cooperation (APEC) Architect as the thirty third (PH033) Philippine member by the PRC Board of Architecture (BoA), Commission on Higher Education Department (CHED). He served as Board examiner of the PRC Specialty Board of Architecture for Interior Design (1986-1990). He served as President of Council of Filipino Consultants "COFIC", a council that advocates excellence and ethical practices and professional discipline in the fields of engineering and architecture, 3rd Vice President of the Confederation of Filipino Consulting Organization Inc.

Raul S. Roco was the best President the country never had. A brilliant lawyer, outstanding legislator, an inspiring leader, public servant, and a true statesman produced by this school of many great Filipinos.

Public service in the Philippines still springs so much hope because of the legacy left by the late Senator Raul S. Roco. His spirit lives on and continues to inspire many of our public servants. He exemplifies the quintessential Bedan leader who will be a continuous source of strength and hope for the Filipino people.

On its tenth-year, the San Beda College Alumni Association (SBCAA) is again awarding the RAUL S. ROCO AWARD FOR PUBLIC SERVICE EXCELLENCE (RRAPSE). The award has been established to give recognition to the ideals which distinguished Raul Roco's life and the exemplary service he rendered to the Filipino people. The award honors Bedans who excelled in the field of public service as evidenced by initiatives, programs and projects that resulted in significant improvements in the life of their constituents, in particular, and/or the Filipino people in general.



This year, the Roco family and the San Beda College Alumni Association have chosen Executive Secretary Salvador C. Medialdea. Salvador "Bingbong" Campos Medialdea of the Law Class'76 is a Filipino lawyer, business executive and government administrator who is the current Executive Secretary of the Philippines, at the start of President Rodrigo Duterte's term on June 30, 2016.

Bingbong, as he is fondly called, is the son of former Supreme Court Associate Justice Leo D. Medialdea who served from 1988 to 1992 under President Corazon Aquino. Born in Manila, Bingbong spent his early years in Davao City, where he was a childhood friend of President Rodrigo Duterte. He attended the Light Bringer School in the city before moving back to Manila to finish high school at Paco Catholic School. He received his BS Commerce Major in Management from Colegio de San Juan de Letran in 1972 and his law degree from San Beda College of Law in 1976. He passed the bar exams the following year.

Bingbong began his legal career as a Senior Associate at ACCRA Law Offices. He then worked as a partner at Pecabar Law Offices, the law firm of Senators Juan Ponce Enrile and Rene Cayetano, before becoming a managing partner at Medialdea Ata Bello Guevarra Suarez Law Firm (MABGS).

From 1996 to 2000, he served as chairman of the Northern Foods Corporation based in Samar. He began work in government in 1998 at the Livelihood Corporation (now National Livelihood Development Corporation) upon the invitation of President Joseph Estrada. In 2000, he was appointed by Estrada as Presidential Assistant for Political Affairs.

Medialdea still serves as Partner at the MABGS Law Firm whose clients include President Duterte. He is also Director for Manchester International Holdings and Accetle Insurance. He also served briefly as Bar Examiner for the Supreme Court in 2006. He is a Partner in Medialdea Ata Bello Guevarra and Suarez (MABGS) Law Offices. This outstanding Bedan started his law career at the Angara Abello Concepcion Regala & Cruz (ACCRA) Law Offices. In 1983, Bingbong, as he is endearingly called by peers, joined the Ponce Enrile Cayetano Baustista Picazo & Reyes (PECABAR) Law Offices where he was a Partner until August 1990. He handled various labor, litigation and immigration referrals.

Atty. Medialdea ventured into government service in 1998 when he was appointed Administrator of the Livelihood Corporation (LIVECOR) where he worked from 23 September 1998 until 30 November 1999. Thereafter, he was appointed Presidential Assistant for Political Affairs on 19 July 2000 and served as such until 31 October 2000. He was President and Director of the Integrated Bar of the Philippines (Rizal Chapter) from 1983 to 1987; charter member of the Rotary Club of Makati Southwest; the first Secretary-General of the ASEAN Law Association (ALA) Golfers' Club; and Member of the Board of Trustees of the San Beda Law Alumni Association (SBLAA). Atty. Medialdea was a Bar Examiner in Labor and Social Legislation given by the Supreme Court in September 2006.

Deservingly, Atty. Bingbong received the 2015 Distinguished Bedan Award, for his exemplary and responsible leadership as an exemplary lawyer; his renown for proven competence, integrity and work ethic; and his having epitomized and exemplified the Benedictine ideals of peace, prayer and work, and the Bedan values of faith, science and virtue.

An exceptional man who bravely dares to make a difference, and who has quietly helped others, especially his alma mater, serving selflessly, and without expectations of recognition, Bingbong is indeed a personification of Bedan gratitude. ## Professorial Chair Program

of the San Beda College  
Alumni Foundation

### INTRODUCTION

In today's 21st century global education, San Beda remains committed to providing assistance to its faculty members to fulfill their vocations to lead, to teach, to become advocates of new knowledge through quality research and be engaged in community service.

To achieve this end, San Beda commits to promote the Benedictine ideals of prayer (*ora*) and work (*labore*); the Bedan values of faith (*fides*), knowledge (*scientia*) and virtues (*virtus*); and, the 10 Hallmarks of Benedictine education among its faculty members.

Sharing in this educational mission, the San Beda College Alumni Foundation (SBCAF) forges a partnership with the school in assisting its educators to grow in the profession and apostolate of teaching, research and community service.

The SBCAF shares also in the belief that a school can only be as good as its faculty members. Thus, the SBCAF serves as a formidable partner of San Beda in providing concrete structures that will ensure that only the best and the brightest academicians are recruited and maintained in its roster of Bedan educators.

One such structure is the establishment and maintenance of a PROFESSORIAL CHAIR PROGRAM. The program was established in AY 1998-1999. The Professorial Chair holder received Php80,000 supporting his/her instructional material OR research output.

However, effective AY 2015-2016, in support of San Beda's research thrust for its faculty members, the SBCAF implemented new institutional guidelines on the granting of the Professorial Chair specifically, the requirement of a research paper to be produced by the Professorial Chair holder.

A full-time faculty is selected to be a holder of a Chair in recognition of his/her outstanding service to the institution. Both academic and administrative service can thus be recognized and honored for a professorial and administrative chair, respectively.



## **ESSENCE**

The Professorial Chair Program administered by the SBCAF is an endowment fund that lends support to San Beda College's distinguished educators in their instructional, community outreach, and research pursuits. The endowment fund is built up by generous individuals, a number of whom are Bedan alumni.

The faculty member awarded a Professorial Chair is given a fund amounting to Php100,000 effective AY 2016-2017, to enhance classroom instruction, engage in community outreach and produce a research paper.

## **OBJECTIVES**

San Beda needs to have a pool of highly qualified, capable and committed faculty members who are engaged in meaningful instruction, research and community service. Through the SBCAF, Professorial Chair Program, the faculty members will be assisted in the above-mentioned endeavors and thus, make San Beda better achieve its mission of Bedan education.

Specifically, with the SBCAF Professorial Chair Program, the institution will be able to:

1. Attract highly qualified faculty members;
2. Encourage and stimulate scholarship through research;
3. Duty recognize meritorious service to the academic community;
4. Recognize outstanding service and dedication to the institution with appropriate dignity and honor.

## **GUIDELINES AND PROCEDURES**

### **A. Establishment of a Professorial Chair**

- 1) The SBCAF invites a Bedan or any benefactor who would like to perpetuate the memory of a loved one to establish an endowment fund.
- 2) The required donation to finance a professorial chair is at least one million pesos.
- 3) The donation is invested by the SBCAF in a bank, and only the earnings from such an investment are given to the chair holder chosen by the SBCAF, as recommended by the College. Funding of the endowment is usually accomplished in either of two ways:
  - a) The donation is made in full. The amount (principal) is then invested for one year. The earnings of the investment are made available for a specific purpose as agreed upon by the donor and the College.
  - b) The donation is made in installments over a specified period of time (x months or x years). In such an arrangement, part of the donation is allocated to building up the principal, while the remaining amount is utilized to fund (partially or in full) the specific purpose desired. Thus, the principal is gradually built up to the total endowment proposed, while yearly expenses for a specific purpose are provided annually.

### **B. Types of Professorial Chair**

The SBCAF classifies the Professorial Chair, viz:

- 1) Professorial Chair for Research Undertaking
  - This type of professorial chair supports the work of a distinguished faculty member in the interest of outstanding research in any academic field.
- 2) Professorial Chair for Outstanding Instruction
  - This type of professorial chair supports the work of a distinguished faculty member in the interest of outstanding instruction shown in the continued dedicated and committed teaching service of a faculty member and production of an instructional material in the form of textbook or module.
- 3) Professorial Chair for Community Service
  - This type of professorial chair supports the work of a distinguished faculty member in the interest of community service where a research on the partner community is produced.



**C. Qualifications of a Professorial Chair holder**

The nominee for a Professorial Chair holder must possess the following:

- 1) Should be at least a master's degree holder
- 2) Must have an academic rank of at least an "Assistant Professor"
- 3) Must be teaching in any of the aforementioned academic departments on a full-time or full-load basis for at least three consecutive years; or as a last priority, teaching on a part-time basis for at least five consecutive years.
- 4) Must have demonstrated excellent teaching capability through obtaining "Very Good to Excellent" rating from the Teachers Behavioral Inventory (TBI) and Administrators' Evaluation for the past five years.
- 5) Must have demonstrated professorial excellence and leadership as well as active participation in both academic and non-academic programs within the school and outside.
- 6) Must have a concept paper or an outline for a proposed research that will be carried out during the period as a professorial chair holder with the technical assistance of the SBC Research and Innovations Office (R.I.O.).

**D. Cash Equivalent of a Chair holder**

The chair holder is entitled to receive Php100,000. Upon granting of the title, the chair holder receives an amount of Php50,000.00, and the remaining Php50,000 will be awarded upon approval of the research paper by the RIO.

**E. Duties and Responsibilities of a Chair holder**

- 1) To prepare a quality research paper or an innovative instructional material to be approved by the RIO.
- 2) To serve as an exemplary model and according to the highest standards of professionalism.
- 3) To be active in both the academic and non-academic functions of the institution.
- 4) To perform other functions related to his/her field of work as may be determined by the SBCAF Professorial Chair Committee.
- 5) The Chair holder is required to deliver a lecture presentation before the faculty about the research undertaken.

**F. Procedures for Conferment of Professorial Chair**

- 1) The SBC Alumni Foundation will inform the RIO about the opening of nominations for the Distinguished Professorial Chairs.
- 2) The RIO will announce the opening of the nomination for the Professorial Chair and accept nominations.
- 3) The RIO will then convene the institutional research council, and deliberate on the nominations submitted. A simple majority vote is required for the nominee to become a Chair holder.
- 4) The RIO will submit its report and recommended Chair holder to the Rector-President.
- 5) The Rector-President will endorse the recommended Chair holder to the SBC Alumni Foundation (SBCAF) board of trustees.
- 6) The SBCAF President will convene the SBCAF Professorial Chair Committee to confirm the recommended Chair holder for final approval of the board of trustees.
- 7) The SBCAF President will inform the Rector-President about the chosen chair holder.
- 8) The SBCAF will award the professorial chair in fitting rites.






